**ORDER GRANTING CANCELLATION OF AUTHORITY TO PROVIDE CUSTOMER
OWNED COIN OR COINLESS OPERATED TELEPHONE SERVICE**

This matter came before Chairman Kenneth C. Hill, Vice Chair Herbert H. Hilliard, and Commissioner Robin L. Morrison of the Tennessee Public Utility Commission (the “Commission” or “TPUC”), the voting panel assigned to this docket, during a regularly scheduled Commission Conference held on September 14, 2020.

Legacy Long Distance International, Inc. (“Legacy” or the “Company”) filed an Application to provide Customer Owned Coin or Coinless Operated Telephone (“COCOT”) Service within the State of Tennessee on January 9, 2017. During a regularly scheduled Commission Conference held on March 13, 2017 the Commissioners found that the Company had met all the requirements of Tenn. Comp. R. & Regs. 1220-04-02-.43 through 1220-04-02-.45 to provide COCOT service in Tennessee and approved the Application. On April 13, 2020, the Company filed a request to cancel its authority. In its request, Legacy informed the Commission that it wishes to voluntarily relinquish its authority and cancel any applicable tariffs and asserts that it has no customers in Tennessee.

Based upon careful consideration of the record in this matter, the Commissioners voted unanimously to grant the Company’s request to cancel its authority to provide COCOT service in

Tennessee.
