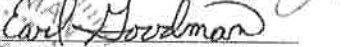

The rates proposed by the Company are subject to approval by the TRA. The TRA may accept, reject, increase or decrease any of the proposed rates in part or in whole. A complete copy of the proposed rates and the reasons for them are on file with the TRA and are available for public inspection. A complete copy is also available in the Company's local offices.
