**ORDER CONVENING A CONTESTED CASE
AND APPOINTING A HEARING OFFICER**

This matter came before Vice Chairman Robin L. Morrison, Director Herbert H. Hilliard and Director Kenneth C. Hill of the Tennessee Regulatory Authority (the "Authority"), the voting panel assigned to this docket, at a regularly scheduled Authority Conference held on March 13, 2017 for the purpose of determining whether to convene a contested case proceeding and appoint a Hearing Officer. On February 8, 2017, Milcrofton Utility District filed a complaint against John Powell and/or King's Chapel Capacity, LLC (together, the "Company") regarding the Company's provision of a well-water pipeline-connected irrigation service for sale to homeowners in the King's Chapel Subdivision located in Williamson County, Tennessee.

During the Authority Conference, the Directors voted unanimously to convene a contested case proceeding and appoint the Authority's General Counsel, or her designee, to act as Hearing Officer to prepare this matter for hearing, with authority to handle all preliminary matters, including but not limited to, establishing a procedural schedule, considering dispositive motions, ruling on intervention requests and discovery issues, and entering a protective order, as needed.
