ORDER ESTABLISHING PROCEDURAL SCHEDULE


This matter came before the Hearing Officer of the Tennessee Public Utility Commission ("Commission" or "TPUC") at a Status Conference held on April 11, 2017 to discuss the issues in the docket and to establish a procedural schedule for the orderly administration of these proceedings. At the Status Conference, Milcrofton Utility District ("Milcrofton") was represented by Ben Gastel, Esq., and Phillip Byron Jones, Esq. represented John Powell, Kings Chapel Capacity, LLC ("KCC"), Ashby Communities ("Ashby"), and Non-Potable Well Water, Inc. (together "King's Chapel").

During the Status Conference, the parties discussed the issues in the docket and came to an agreement on a procedural schedule. After much discussion regarding the appropriate subjects of the complaint and whether the Commission has jurisdiction in this matter, the Hearing Officer determined that Milcrofton should file an Amended Complaint naming the appropriate parties and a brief addressing the jurisdictional issues. After King's Chapel has responded to the Amended Complaint and brief on Commission jurisdiction, the Hearing Officer will set a deadline for dispositive motions. Based on the agreements made by the parties

regarding the procedural schedule, the Hearing Officer hereby establishes the Procedural Schedule set forth below.
