**ORDER CONVENING A CONTESTED CASE
AND APPOINTING A HEARING OFFICER**

This matter came before Chairman David F. Jones, Vice Chairman Robin L. Morrison and Commissioner Keith Jordan of the Tennessee Public Utility Commission (the “Commission”), the voting panel assigned to this docket, at a regularly scheduled Commission Conference held on October 23, 2017 for the purpose of determining whether to convene a contested case proceeding and appoint a Hearing Officer. On September 12, 2017, Receivership Management, Inc., the court appointed receiver of the Laurel Hills Water System, filed a petition, solely in its capacity as receiver, for a Provisional Certificate of Public Convenience and Necessity to operate the water distribution system within the development in Cumberland County, Tennessee, known as Renegade Mountain. Petitions to intervene were filed on October 9, 2017 and October 11, 2017 by the Consumer Protection and Advocate Division of the Office of the Attorney General and Renegade Mountain Community Club, respectively.

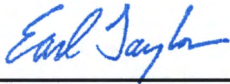
During the Commission Conference, the Commissioners voted unanimously to convene a contested case proceeding and appoint the Commission’s General Counsel, or her designee, to

act as Hearing Officer to prepare this matter for a hearing before the panel, with authority to handle all preliminary matters, including but not limited to, the establishment of a procedural schedule to completion, as well as the consideration of motions, requests for intervention and discovery, and the issuance of a protective order, as needed.
