Dear Sharla:

I am writing on behalf of the Nolensville/College Grove Utility District ("NCGUD") in response to statements made concerning NCGUD in the above-captioned application filed by Superior Water Service for a certificate of convenience and necessity. In the application, Superior states that it intends to purchase water from NCGUD and that "a final water supply agreement between Superior Water Service" and NCGUD "is pending approval of this CNN filing by the Tennessee Public Utility Commission in accordance with T.C.A. § 7-82-301(a)(1)(B)." Application, Exhibit 4.

At this time, NCGUD has had some preliminary, internal discussions concerning Superior's application and whether or not NCGUD would be willing to sell water to Superior. NCGUD, however, has not made any decisions concerning this issue. Moreover, NCGUD disagrees with Superior's statement that a decision by NCGUD to sell water to Superior hinges on a determination by the Tennessee Public Utility Commission made "in accordance with T.C.A. § 7-82-301(a)(1)(B)." To the contrary, that statute applies to proceedings before the County Executive, not the Commission, and NCGUD has never stated otherwise.
