ORDER CONVENING A CONTESTED CASE AND APPOINTING A HEARING OFFICER

This matter came before Chairman David F. Jones, Vice Chairman Robin L. Morrison and Commissioner Herbert H. Hilliard of the Tennessee Public Utility Commission (the "Commission"), the voting panel assigned to this docket, at a regularly scheduled Commission Conference held on December 12, 2017 for the purpose of determining whether to convene a contested case proceeding and appoint a Hearing Officer. On October 31, 2017, Superior Water Service, LLC filed a petition for a Certificate of Public Convenience and Necessity to provide water service to a portion of King's Chapel Subdivision in Williamson County, Tennessee. A *Joint Petition to Intervene and Motion to Dismiss* was filed on November 27, 2017 by Nolensville/College Grove Utility District and Milcrofton Utility District. On November 28, 2017, the Consumer Protection and Advocate Division of the Office of the Attorney General filed a *Petition to Intervene*.

During the Commission Conference, the Commissioners voted unanimously to convene a contested case proceeding and appoint the Commission's General Counsel, or her designee, to act as Hearing Officer to prepare this matter for a hearing before the panel, with authority to handle all preliminary matters, including but not limited to, consideration of all motions, including dispositive motions, the establishment of a procedural schedule to completion, requests for intervention and discovery, and the issuance of a protective order, as needed.
