Administrative Closure of Docket No. 17-00142

On December 14, 2017, YMax Communications Corp. ("YMax") filed a *Notification* indicating that it is involved in a transaction whereby it would undergo an indirect transfer of control. The Consumer Protection and Advocate Division of the Office of the Attorney General ("Consumer Advocate") filed a *Petition to Intervene* on February 9, 2018. On February 26, 2018 YMax filed a *Letter* stating that the transaction described in the *Notification* will not have any effect on a settlement agreement which YMax and its affiliate magicJack LP entered into with the State of Tennessee in 2015 regarding the payment of 911 fees to the Tennessee Emergency Communications Board. The Consumer Advocate withdrew its *Petition to Intervene* on February 28, 2018.

Ymax elected market regulation in Docket No. 09-00181 on November 12, 2009. T.C.A. § 65-5-109(n) provides a description of the regulatory requirements that apply to companies that elect Market Regulation. The transaction described in the *Notification* is governed by T.C.A. 65-4-113 which is not a regulatory requirement that applies to companies that have elected Market Regulation. As such, the transaction described in the *Notification* does not require approval. Given that no approval of the transaction described in *Notification* is required, this docket should be closed.
