APPLICATION OF VERO FIBER NETWORKS, LLC TO PROVIDE COMPETING LOCAL TELECOMMUNICATIONS SERVICES

Vero Fiber Networks, LLC, ("Vero Fiber" or "Applicant") respectfully requests that the Tennessee Regulatory Authority ("TRA") grant to Vero Fiber authority to provide competing local telecommunications services, including exchange access telecommunication services, within the State of Tennessee. Vero Fiber is willing and able to comply with all applicable TRA policies, rules, and orders in Tennessee pertaining to the provision of competing local telecommunications services. T.C.A. § 65-4-201.

Applicant does not have any parents, affiliates, or subsidiaries. A copy of Applicant's Organizational Chart is attached hereto as **Exhibit A**.

3. Corporate Information

Applicant is a limited liability company organized on October 13, 2017 under the laws of the state of Colorado. See Articles of Organization in **Exhibit B.** A copy of Applicant's authority to transact business in the State of Tennessee is provided in **Exhibit C.** The names and addresses of the principal corporate officers are in **Exhibit D.** There are no officers in Tennessee. The biographies of the principal officers and any other key technical staff are in **Exhibit E.**

4. Applicant possesses the managerial, technical, and financial ability to provide local telecommunications service in the State of Tennessee as demonstrated below

A. Financial Qualifications

Applicant has the financial ability to render the local exchange telecommunications services for which this Application is submitted. In support of its financial qualifications, Applicant submits its pro forma financial report on a confidential basis provided in **Confidential Exhibit F.** Because Applicant is a privately held company, Applicant requests that the financial statements appended hereto as Exhibit F be treated as confidential. Accordingly, Applicant has provided the requisite labeling as "Confidential" on Exhibit F submitted with this Application.

In accordance with T.C.A. § 65-4-125(j), Applicant will supplement this Application, as **Exhibit H**, with a corporate surety bond or irrevocable letter of credit, as applicable.

B. Managerial Ability:

As previously shown on **Exhibit E** of this Application, Applicant has the managerial expertise to successfully operate a telecommunications enterprise in Tennessee. Applicant's management team has extensive management and business experience in Telecommunications.

C. Technical Qualifications

Applicant will satisfy the standards established by the TRA, including quality of service and billing standards required of all LEC's regulated by the TRA. Applicant will file and maintain tariffs in the manner prescribed by the TRA. Applicant will not require customers to purchase CPE, which cannot be used with the Incumbent Local Exchange Carriers' systems. As noted in the biographies in **Exhibit E**, the principal officers of the company include many individuals with several years of telecommunications expertise. Thus, Applicant is technically qualified to provide local exchange service in Tennessee.

5. Proposed Service Areas

Applicant seeks authority to provide local exchange telecommunications services in any territory in the State of Tennessee.

6. Types of Local Exchange Service to be Provided

Applicant seeks authority to enter the Tennessee market as a provider of limited facilities-based local exchange service, specifically by primarily providing essential broadband infrastructure to schools and libraries by connecting district locations with fiber optic cable that provides reliable, scaleable, and secure connectivity through the federal E-rate program. Applicant intends to deliver an aggregation of technologies utilizing fiber optic cable depending on the customer's location and needs. Applicant will offer leasing of dedicated fiber optic strands to allow schools and libraries to create their own privately-operated fiber optic network. This type of dedicated, purpose-built dark fiber networks are physically separate from other customers and controlled by the end-user. Applicant will also provide private lit fiber network for schools and libraries wanting assistance with running their networks and associated equipment.

Applicant desires to provide broadband service using fiber optic cabling that is either leased from other providers, placed within existing rights-of-way and/or conduits that are leased from other providers, or constructed within existing rights-of-way or via pole attachment arrangements. Applicant may seek to deploy its own facilities in or on existing structures. It is Applicant's understanding that without a Certificate, incumbent local exchange carriers have refused to allow entities to use their conduit or poles. It is therefore necessary for Applicant to have a Certificate so that it may obtain interconnection agreements with the incumbent local exchange carriers, pole attachment agreements with local utility companies, and franchise agreements and permitting arrangements with local municipalities in Tennessee.

7. Repair and Maintenance

Applicant understands the importance of effective customer service for local service customers. Applicant will make arrangements for its customers to call the company at a toll-free customer service number. In addition, customers will be able to contact the company in writing at the headquarters address, as well as via email. The toll-free number will be printed on the customer's monthly billing statements. The customer service contact person knowledgeable about Applicant's operations is Scott Beer, Executive VP of Business Development and Chief Legal Officer. Mr. Beer's mailing address, telephone number, and email address are in Section 1 of this Application.

Grant of the Application will further the goals of the Tennessee Legislature and further the public interest by expanding the availability of competitive telecommunications services in the State of Tennessee. In addition, intrastate offering of these services is in the public interest because the services will provide Tennessee customers increased efficiencies and cost savings. Authorizing Applicant to provide local exchange telecommunications services will enhance materially the telecommunications infrastructure in the State of Tennessee and will facilitate economic development.

In particular, the public will benefit both directly, through the use of the competitive services to be offered by Applicant, and indirectly because Applicant's presence in Tennessee will increase the incentives for other telecommunications providers to operate more efficiently, offer more innovative services, reduce their prices, and improve their quality of service. Grant of this Application will further enhance the service options available to Tennessee citizens for the reasons set forth above.

12. Tennessee Specific Operational Issues:

Questions 1-4 concerning Tennessee Specific Operational Issues are not applicable to the services Applicant intends to offer. Scott Beer will be responsible to work with the TRA on resolving customer complaints. His contact information is in Section 1 of this Application. Applicant does not intend to telemarket its services in Tennessee.

Applicant has not been denied requested certification in any jurisdiction. Applicant has not been

subject to complaints in any of the states in which we are now seeking to do business.

d. Subsequent to the approval of this Application, Applicant will file any necessary tariffs prior to providing the proposed services covered by this Application.

CONCLUSION

Vero Fiber respectfully requests that the TRA enter an order granting it a certificate of convenience and necessity to operate as a competing telecommunications service provider and authority to provide a full range of local exchange services on a facilities-based and resale basis throughout the State of Tennessee. Vero Fiber also respectfully requests expedited treatment for approval of its application. For the reasons stated above, Vero Fiber's provision of these services would promote the public interest by providing high-quality service at competitive prices and by creating greater economic incentives for the development and improvement for all competing providers.



SMALL AND MINORITY-OWNED TELECOMMUNICATIONS BUSINESS PARTICIPATION PLAN VERO FIBER NETWORKS, LLC

Pursuant to T.C.A. § 65-5-112, as amended, Vero Fiber Networks, LLC ("Vero Fiber") submits this small and minority-owned telecommunications business participation plan (the "Plan") along with its Application for a Certificate of Public Convenience and Necessity to provide competing intrastate and local exchange services in Tennessee.

I. PURPOSE

The purpose of § 65-5-112, T.C.A. is to provide opportunities for small and minority-owned businesses to provide goods and services to telecommunications service providers. Vero Fiber is committed to the goals of § 65-5-112, T.C.A. and to taking steps to support the participation of small and minority-owned telecommunications businesses in the telecommunications industry. Vero Fiber will endeavor to provide opportunities for small and minority-owned telecommunications businesses to compete for contracts and subcontracts for goods and services. As part of its procurement process, Vero Fiber will make efforts to identify and inform minority-owned and small businesses that are qualified and capable of providing goods and services to Vero Fiber of such opportunities. Once it begins operations, Vero Fiber will contact the Department of

Economic and Community Development, the administrator of the small and minority owned Telecommunications assistance program, to obtain a list of qualified vendors. Moreover, Vero Fiber will seek to increase awareness of such opportunities so that companies not otherwise identified will have sufficient information to participate in the procurement process.

II. DEFINITIONS

As defined in § 65-5-112, T.C.A.:

Minority-Owned Business. Minority-owned business shall mean a business which is solely owned, or at lease fifty-one percent (51%) of the assets or outstanding stock of which is owned, by an individual who personally manages and controls daily operations of such business, and who is impeded from normal entry into the economic mainstream because of race, religion, sex or national origin and such business has annual gross receipts of less than four million dollars (\$4,000,000).

Small Business. Small Business shall mean a business with annual gross receipts of less than four million dollars (\$4,000,000).

III. ADMINISTRATION

Vero Fiber's Plan will be overseen and administered by the individual named below, hereinafter referred to as the Administrator, who will be responsible for carrying out and promoting Vero Fiber's full efforts to provide equal opportunities for small and minority owned businesses. The Administrator of the Plan will be:

The Administrator's responsibilities will include:

- (1) Maintaining an updated Plan in full compliance with T.C.A. § 65-5-112 and the rules and orders of the Tennessee Regulatory Authority.
- (2) Establishing and developing policies and procedures necessary for the successful implementation of the Plan.
- (3) Preparing and submitting such forms as may be required by the Tennessee Regulatory Authority, including the filing of required annual updates.
- (4) Serving as the primary liaison to and cooperating with the Tennessee Regulatory Authority, other agencies of the State of Tennessee, and small and minority-owned businesses to locate and use qualified small and minority-owned businesses as defined in T.C.A. § 65-5-112.
- (5) Searching for and developing opportunities to use small and minority-owned businesses and encouraging such businesses to participate in and bid on contracts and subcontracts.
- (6) Providing records and reports and cooperating in any authorized surveys as required by the Tennessee Regulatory Authority.
- (7) Establishing a record-keeping system to track qualified small and minority-owned businesses and efforts to use such businesses.
- (8) Providing information and educational activities to persons within Vero Fiber and training such persons to seek out, encourage, and promote the use of small and minority owned businesses. In performance of these duties, the Administrator will utilize a number of resources, including:

Chambers of Commerce

The Tennessee Department of Economic and Community Development

The United States Department of Commerce

Small Business Administration

Office of Minority Business

The National Minority Supplier Development Counsel

The National Association of Women Business Owners

The National Association of Minority Contractors

Historically Black Colleges, Universities, and Minority Institutions

The efforts to promote and ensure equal opportunities for small and minority-owned businesses are primarily spelled out in the Administrator's duties above. Additional efforts to provide opportunities to small and minority-owned businesses will include offering, where appropriate and feasible, small and minority-owned businesses assistance with technical, insurance, bonding, licensing, production, and deadline requirements.

IV. RECORDS AND COMPLIANCE REPORTS

Vero Fiber will maintain records of qualified small and minority-owned business and efforts to use the goods and services of such businesses. In addition, Vero Fiber will maintain records of educational and training activities conducted or attended and of the internal procurement procedures adopted to support this plan.

Vero Fiber will submit records and reports required by the Tennessee Regulatory Authority concerning the Plan. Moreover, Vero Fiber will cooperate fully with any surveys and studies required by the Tennessee Regulatory Authority.

- Q. PLEASE STATE YOUR NAME, BUSINESS ADDRESS AND TELEPHONE NUMBER.
- A. My name is Scott Beer. My business address is 1023 Walnut Street, Boulder, Colorado 80302. My business telephone number is (303) 350-4060.
- Q. WHAT IS YOUR POSITION WITH VERO FIBER NETWORKS, LLC?
- A. I am the Executive Vice President of Business Development and Chief Legal Officer of Vero Fiber Networks, LLC ("Vero Fiber").
- Q. ARE ALL STATEMENTS IN VERO FIBER'S APPLICATION TRUE AND CORRECT TO THE BEST OF YOUR KNOWLEDGE, INFORMATION, AND BELIEF?

Yes.

O. WHAT IS THE PURPOSE OF YOUR TESTIMONY IN THIS PROCEEDING?

A. The purpose of my testimony is to describe the services that Vero Fiber proposes to offer in Tennessee, and to review issues related to Vero Fiber's request for a license to provide such services. My testimony specifically addresses Vero Fiber's managerial, technical, and financial competence to provide telecommunications services for which authority is requested, and its compliance with the rules and policies of the Tennessee Regulatory Authority ("TRA").

Q. WHAT AUTHORITY IS VERO FIBER SEEKING FROM THE TRA?

A. Vero Fiber seeks authority to offer basic local exchange service in all incumbent local exchange carriers' service territories throughout the state of Tennessee.

Q. IS VERO FIBER LEGALLY AUTHORIZED TO DO BUSINESS IN TENNESSEE?

A. Yes. Vero Fiber is a Colorado Limited Liability Company. It has no parents, subsidiaries, or

affiliates. Vero Fiber's Articles of Organization and authority to transact business in the State of Tennessee are attached to its Application as **Exhibit C.**

Q. PLEASE DESCRIBE YOUR BACKGROUND IN THE TELECOMMUNICATIONS INDUSTRY.

A. I have 15 years' experience in the telecommunications industry including regulatory compliance and telecommunications management. Further, Vero Fiber has over 60 years of experience in the telecommunications industry as demonstrated in **Exhibit E** to Vero's Fiber's Application.

Q. PLEASE DESCRIBE VERO FIBER AND THE TYPES OF SERVICES THAT IT WILL PROVIDE IN TENNESSEE.

A. Vero Fiber is a Colorado Limited Liability Company formed on October 13, 2017, with its headquarters in Boulder, Colorado. Vero Fiber seeks authority to provide basic local exchange service in all incumbent local exchange carriers' service territories throughout the state of Tennessee, specifically by primarily providing essential broadband infrastructure to schools and libraries by connecting district locations with fiber optic cable that provides reliable, scaleable, and secure connectivity through the federal E-rate program.

Vero Fiber intends to deliver an aggregation of technologies utilizing fiber optic cable depending on the customer's location and needs. Vero Fiber will offer leasing of dedicated fiber optic strands to allow schools and libraries to create their own privately-operated fiber optic network. This type of dedicated, purpose-built dark fiber networks are physically separate from other customers and controlled by the end-user. Vero Fiber will also provide private lit fiber network for schools and libraries wanting assistance with running their networks and associated equipment.

Vero Fiber desires to provide broadband service using fiber optic cabling that is either leased from other providers, placed within existing rights-of-way and/or conduits that are leased from other providers, or constructed within existing rights-of-way or via pole attachment arrangements. Vero Fiber may seek to deploy its own facilities in or on existing structures. It is Vero Fiber's understanding that without a license, incumbent local exchange carriers have refused to allow entities to use their conduit or poles. It is therefore necessary for Vero Fiber to have a license so that it may obtain interconnection agreements with the incumbent local exchange carriers, pole attachment agreements with local utility companies, and franchise agreements and permitting arrangements with local municipalities in Tennessee.

- Q. DOES VERO FIBER HAVE ADEQUATE ACCESS TO THE CAPITAL NECESSARY TO PROVIDE SERVICE IN TENNESSEE?
- A. Yes, Vero Fiber possesses the financial qualifications required of applicants for licenses. Vero Fiber has access to the financing necessary to fulfill any obligations it may undertake with respect to the operation and maintenance of the services specified in the Application. **Confidential Exhibit F** contains pro forma financials for Vero Fiber which demonstrates that it has adequate capital available to provide the proposed service in Tennessee. Because Vero Fiber is a privately held company and its financial statements are not public information, I am requesting confidential treatment of this exhibit.
- Q. IF AUTHORIZED TO PROVIDE LOCAL TELECOMMUNICATIONS SERVICES, WILL VERO FIBER ABIDE BY THE RULES, STATUTES, REGULATIONS, POLICIES, AND ORDERS OF THE COMMISSION, AND THE LAWS OF TENNESSEE, IN ITS PROVISION OF SERVICES, INCLUDING

- A. Yes.

- A. Vero Fiber intends to offer services in the entire state of Tennessee.

- A. Granting this Application will promote the public interest by increasing competition in the provision of telecommunications services in Tennessee. By enhancing competition, Vero Fiber will bring significant benefits to telecommunications users within Tennessee by providing: (a) lower-priced and better-quality service; (b) innovative telecommunications services; (c) efficient use of existing communications resources; and (d) increased diversification and reliability in the supply of communications services.
