### CONSUMER ADVOCATE'S PROPOSED PROCEDURAL SCHEDULE TO ADDRESS REMAINING ISSUES STEMMING FROM THE 2017 TAX CUTS AND JOBS ACT

The Consumer Advocate Unit in the Financial Division of the Office of the Tennessee Attorney General (Consumer Advocate) hereby submits its proposed procedural schedule to resolve the remaining issues in this Docket concerning the implications of the 2017 Tax Cuts and Jobs Act (TCJA). In support of its proposal, the Consumer Advocate avers the following:

- 1. On December 22, 2017, President Trump signed the TCJA into law. The TCJA's provisions have had significant impacts on utility rates throughout the country. The Tennessee Public Utility Commission opened Docket No. 18-00001 to investigate appropriate tax treatment for public utilities in Tennessee.
- 2. On March 29, 2018, Chattanooga Gas Company (CGC or Company) filed its Compliance Filing and Report with the Commission concerning how the Company proposed to handle TCJA implications within its rates. CGC's Compliance Filing and Report initiated this Docket.
- 3. While some tax issues were addressed in Docket No. 18-00017, CGC's last general rate case, at least two outstanding issues remain. On June 27, 2019, the Hearing Officer issued an *Order Establishing Issues for Consideration*. In the *Order*, the Hearing Officer determined as follows:

The following issues, as proposed by the Consumer Advocate, shall be considered in this docket:

- 1) the treatment of excess deferred income taxes amortized by Chattanooga Gas Company beginning January 1, 2018, as set forth on p. 55 of the Tennessee Public Utility Commission Order in Docket No. 18-00017;
- 2) the appropriate disposition of Income Tax Expense savings accrued during the period January 1, 2018, through the date new Chattanooga Gas Company rates became effective.
- 4. To that end, and in order to resolve the remaining issues in a reasonable timeframe for CGC and its ratepayers, the Consumer Advocate submits the following procedural schedule:
