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AGREED MOTION FOR CONTINUANCE AND TO SUBMIT CASE TO COMMISSION FOR "PAPER" HEARING ON THE MERITS

The hearing in the above-captioned matter (the "Hearing") is set by the Tennessee Public Utility Commission (the "Commission" or "TPUC") for March 9, 2020 at 1:00 p.m. (CST), in Conference Room G.201 located on the Ground Floor of the Andrew Jackson State Office Building, 500 Deaderick Street, Nashville, Tennessee 37243. For good cause shown, Tennessee-American Water Company ("Tennessee-American," "TAWC" or "Company) submits this Agreed Motion for Continuance and to Submit Case to Commission for Paper Hearing on the Merits (the "Motion"). Counsel for TAWC has been authorized to represent herein that the Consumer Advocate Unit in the Financial Division of the Office of the Attorney General is not opposed to the Motion. In support of the Motion, TAWC provides the following:

As the Commission is well-aware, the Coronavirus is spreading across the globe, including here in the United States. Most recently, Tennessee's first confirmed case of the Coronavirus was reported today. While appropriate governmental and leading medical authorities have encouraged Americans to avoid panic, they have also advised the exercise of care, discretion and preventive measures. American Water Works Company, parent of TAWC,

operates across the country in thirty-seven (37) states. On March 3, 2020, American Water Works Company, exercising such care, discretion and prevention announced the attached Travel and Meeting Directive, effective immediately through April 30, 2020. Mr. John Wilde is the witness who has submitted pre-filed testimony on behalf of TAWC in Phase II of this matter. Mr. Wilde's business address is 1 Water Street, Camden, New Jersey, and his home address is 2200 Benjamin Franklin Parkway Unit 607, Philadelphia, PA.

Given American Water Works Company's Travel and Meeting Directive, Mr. Wilde's location, and the particular and unique nature of the contested issues presented in this case, TAWC requests, in an abundance of caution and in consideration of public safety, that the Hearing currently set for March 9, 2020 be continued. Although the Consumer Advocate Unit in the Financial Division of the Office of the Attorney General ("Consumer Advocate") initially proposed alternative solutions in an attempt to address health and safety concerns while also preserving the Hearing date of March 9th, counsel for TAWC has been authorized to represent that the Consumer Advocate is in agreement that the Hearing can be postponed and that the proposed procedure outlined in this Motion is an acceptable course for adoption by the Commission.

Further, relying again upon the unique nature of the contested issues presented in this case, TAWC and the Consumer Advocate (the "Parties") also jointly request that the Commission resolve the contested issues on the merits based upon the official record in Docket No. 18-00039 and accept this official record, including discovery, into evidence. The Parties are fully persuaded that the pre-filed testimony in this case is sufficient for the Commission to resolve the contested issues on the merits without a live hearing. Therefore, under the circumstances presented, the Parties waive a "live" hearing, including opening and closing

statements, witness summaries and cross-examination. The Parties believe the contested issues can be resolved in full on the record in Docket No. 18-00039. In the event the Commission requires any information not already contained with the existing record in Docket No. 18-00039 to resolve the contested issues without an in-person, "live" hearing, the Parties agree to timely respond to any forthcoming Commission Data Request.

WHEREFORE, based on the foregoing, and for good cause shown, Tennessee-American Water Company respectfully requests that the Commission enter an Order granting the Agreed Motion for Continuance and to Submit Case to Commission for Paper Hearing on the Merits.

NEW TRAVEL AND MEETING DIRECTIVE

IN RESPONSE TO THE CORONAVIRUS (COVID-19)

The health and safety of our employees is our top priority. We provide an essential service and it is critically important that we stay healthy for our families, our customers and ourselves.

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Much like many other companies across the globe, American Water has established a coronavirus preparedness plan. To minimize the risk of exposure to the coronavirus (COVID-19) and out of an abundance of caution, we are implementing several companywide measures, effective immediately through April 30, 2020. We will continue to monitor the situation and adopt and amend measures as necessary. As we do, we will provide you with important updates.

TRAVEL

- All international and domestic business travel (plane, train, overnight stay) is suspended. Any
 request for exceptions must be approved by the executive leadership team.
- Any employee, contractor, or visitor who has visited a country identified by the CDC, or has
 been in close contact with someone who has visited those countries, must remain out of the
 workplace for 14 days after returning to the U.S.
- For any personal travel plans, please exercise increased caution, take the appropriate
 preventative measures to care for your health and safety, and stay current with those
 countries identified by the CDC where non-essential travel is highly discouraged.
 - Employees who plan personal travel domestically or internationally are asked to report their travel by completing the "<u>Travel Report Form</u>" or by calling the security hotline 1-866-801-1123

MEETINGS

- Meetings that would normally require participants to travel should be scheduled as virtual meetings, postponed, or canceled.
- Employee attendance at external conventions, forums, conferences, and events should be canceled or attended virtually.
- Internal meetings of greater than 25 people should be scheduled as virtual meetings, postponed or canceled. Internal meetings of fewer than 25 people are permitted, however virtual meetings should be utilized whenever possible.
- Use of our facilities for external meetings should be canceled.
- External visitors should be limited whenever possible and must verify they have not traveled to a country identified by the CDC within the last 14 days.

FIELD EMPLOYEES

- Employees are empowered to not enter a customer home/business if they do not feel safe.
- Inside work should be limited/deferred where practical. Health & Safety will provide additional guidance to safely perform work at a customers' home or business.

Business critical or non-deferrable exceptions to this directive requires a waiver submitted to coronavirus@amwater.com and approval by an ELT member.

- Safety and Security will support risk assessment for business critical or non-deferrable exceptions.
- All vendors that provide staffing will be notified immediately of the new requirements.
- We will continue to follow guidelines from the CDC, the World Health Organization (WHO), and other government efforts.

Again, nothing comes before safety. We thank you in advance for your cooperation. Be safe.
