**MOTION TO ALLOW COUNSEL AND WITNESS
TO APPEAR AND PARTICIPATE AT HEARING BY TELEPHONE**

Kentucky Utilities Company (“KU” or the “Company”) filed its Petition in this docket on May 11, 2018. In a response to a Data Request filed on May 23, 2018, KU requested that it be heard at the Tennessee Public Utility Commission’s (“Commission”) Conference scheduled for July 23-24, 2018.

Pursuant to T.C.A. §4-5-312(c), KU submits this Motion to Allow Counsel and Witness to Appear and Participate at Hearing by Telephone and provides the following in support of this Motion:

T.C.A. §4-5-312(c) addresses electronic participation and reads:

In the discretion of the administrative judge or hearing officer and agency members and by agreement of the parties, all or part of the hearing may be conducted by telephone, television or other electronic means, if each participant in the hearing has an opportunity to participate in, to hear, and if technically feasible, to see the entire proceedings while taking place.

Consistent with this statute, KU respectfully requests that its counsel and witness be allowed to participate in the hearing on its Petition via telephone because personal appearance by the company’s counsel and witness, who reside in Louisville, Kentucky, would be burdensome. If possible, KU requests that the Conference be scheduled for July 24, 2018.

If the Motion is granted, KU agrees that its appearance and participation by telephone will be subject to the following conditions.

1. KU shall be required to secure a licensed Notary Public in good standing in the State of Kentucky (the jurisdiction where the testimony is to be given) who will be in the same physical location with the witness while he is providing testimony.

2. The Notary Public obtained by KU shall be duly authorized to administer the testimonial oath and shall administer such oath during the hearing and remain physically present with the witness at all times during the witness's testimony and until the witness is excused from examination by the Authority or Hearing Officer.


3. After the hearing, the Notary Public shall prepare and sign an affidavit, which bears the official seal of the Notary Public, affirming: (1) the proven identity of the witness, (2) the fact that the Notary Public properly administered the testimonial oath to such person, and (3) that the testimony given by the sworn witness was in accordance with ethical and legal standards, as observed by the Notary Public. In addition, the testifying witness shall sign a conforming Witness Certification in the form attached hereto as Exhibit A or in such other format ordered by the Commission.

The original Witness Certification and Notary Public Affidavit must be postmarked within five days of the hearing and received by the Commission's Docket Manager via postage-paid U.S. Mail or other courier.

WHEREFORE, Kentucky Utilities Company respectfully requests that the Commission enter an Order granting KU's Motion to allow its counsel and witness to participate by telephone in the Commission Conference that KU anticipates will be scheduled on July 23-24, 2018.
