Tickets are on sale now for the Gateway Chamber Orchestra's 10th anniversary season, titled *Inspiration Abounds*.

The four-concert Masterworks Series will explore composers that have shaped the Gateway Chamber Orchestra (GCO) over the past decade, culminating with a new festival dedicated to Franz Joseph Haydn in April. Internationally acclaimed soloists are scheduled to perform, including Los Angeles Philharmonic principal clarinet Boris Allakhverdyan.

Join the GCO for a classical musical experience that will surprise and entertain as you listen to some of the most noteworthy musicians in the Southeast. This season begins with a slate of American originals, and the following concerts feature other GCO favorites, including Wolfgang Amadeus Mozart.

"The 2018-19 season is a celebration of our first 10 years," Gateway Chamber Orchestra Music Director Gregory Wolynec said. "Each program will take a closer look at composers

and works that have shaped our identity with prominent American composers, fascinating works from the Second Viennese School, as well as Mozart and Haydn. This is a celebration of the music that has launched our orchestra."

Season tickets (includes four events) begin at \$50 for students/military and \$80 for adults. The Gateway Chamber Orchestra performs at the Franklin Theatre, with concerts on Monday evenings.

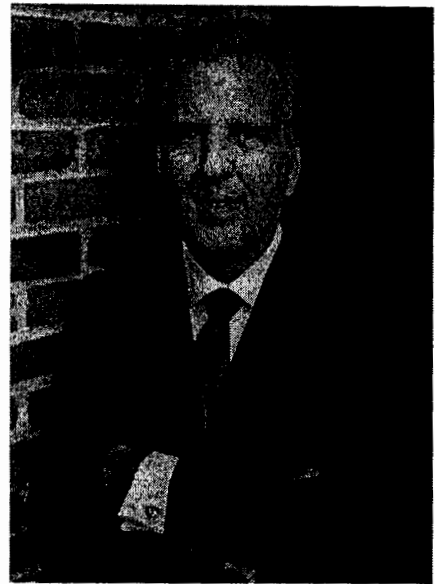

Notice is hereby given that Atmos Energy Corporation (the Company) filed a Petition with the Tennessee Public Utility Commission (TPUC) on August 22, 2018 in Docket 18-00089, seeking approval pursuant to Tenn. Code Ann. 65-4-107 of a franchise agreement with Williamson County. This franchise agreement grants the Company the non-exclusive rights, authority, privilege and franchise to construct, maintain, and operate a System for the distribution of gas, in, upon, under, along across and over Public Right of Way owned or controlled by County, in the present or future limits of County, for the supplying and selling of gas and gas by products to County and the inhabitants, institutions and businesses in County, and for such other purposes to construct, lay down, maintain, and operate all necessary gas mains, service pipes, and other appliances, fixtures, and facilities as may be necessary for the transmission, distribution, and sale of such to County and the inhabitants thereof for domestic, commercial, industrial, and institutional uses, and other purposes for which it is or may hereafter be used. The rates proposed are the same as the currently approved rates. A complete copy of the Company's filing is on file with the TPUC and are open for public inspection. The franchise and the rights granted shall take effect upon approval of the TPUC and shall continue in force for fifteen (15) years. During each year of the term hereof, the Company shall collect from its customers within the unincorporated areas of Williamson County a franchise fee in an amount of 5% of Company's Revenues within the unincorporated areas of the County, as defined in the agreement. Said franchise fee shall be paid quarterly to Williamson County with each payment due and payable within thirty (30) days from the end of the quarter for which payment is due, so long as the Company shall supply and sell natural gas to the public within said County, or so long as this franchise is in effect. WHEREAS the Deed of Trust conveyed a security interest in the real property therein described located in Williamson County, Tennessee, securing an indebtedness in the original principal amount of Ten Million Five Hundred Thousand and No/100 Dollars (\$10,500,000.00) as fully described in that certain Promissory Note dated October 30, 2015, together with any and all renewals, amendments, supplements, or modifications (the "Note"); and

WHEREAS, Michael Anthony Shaw was appointed Successor Trustee under the terms of the Appointment of Successor Trustee executed by Lender, of record with the Register's Office, bearing instrument Number 17045031 in Book 7219, Page 412, together with all the rights, powers and privileges of the original Trustee named in the Deed of Trust; and
