Tennessee American Water Company ("TAWC" or "Company") filed its annual Capital Recovery Riders Petition with the Tennessee Public Utility Commission (the "Commission") in Docket No. 18-00120 on November 16, 2018, seeking approval of certain expendiures under the Qualified Infrastructure mprovement Program ("GIP"), the Economic Development Investment Program ("EDI") and the Safety and Environmental Compliance Program ("SEC") or the upcoming year, 2019.

The Capital Recovery Riders are authorized alternative regulatory methods and mechanisms that permit TAWC to recover certain costs without a full-plown general rate case, as long as specific criteria are satisfied, including, but not limited to, the Commission finding that such alternative methods and mechanisms are in the public interest. A further explanation of the Capital Recovery is available through the Commission to both TPUC Docket Nos. 13-00130 and 18-00120. Below is a summation of the Capital Recovery Riders that will be reviewed in the upcoming hearing in Docket No. 18-00120.

If the surcharge changes proposed by TAWC are approved by the Commission, ncluding the customer credit or offset resulting from the federal corporate insome tax expense reduction, a typical esidential customer living in the City of Chattanooga, and using an average of 4,154 gallons per month, would experience an increase in their bill of about 50.59 per month, or 57.08 per year. The TCJA offset would result in the same bustomer experiencing a decrease in heir bill of approximately \$1.43 per month, or \$17.16 per year.
