ORDER RE-SUSPENDING TARIFF THROUGH AUGUST 12, 2019


This matter is before the Hearing Officer appointed by the voting panel of Commissioners of the Tennessee Public Utility Commission ("Commission" or "TPUC") and designated by General Counsel to administer certain preliminary issues that may arise during the preparation of this matter for hearing before the Commission. On November 16, 2018, pursuant to Tenn. Code Ann. § 65-5-103 *et seq.*, Tennessee-American Water Company ("TAWC" or the "Company") filed its *Petition* regarding the 2019 investment and related expenses under the Qualified Infrastructure Investment Program rider, the Economic Development Investment rider, and the Safety and Environmental Compliance rider, along with the proposed tariffs.

Tenn. Code Ann. § 65-5-103(a) permits the Commission, pending a hearing and determination, to suspend any rate increase, change, or alteration for an initial period not to

exceed three months from the proposed effective date of such increase, change, or alteration.¹ The Hearing Officer initially suspended the tariff through March 11, 2019 and re-suspended it through July 15, 2019; however, because the Commission's investigation, hearing, and final determination on the Company's proposed tariff cannot be completed by that date, the Hearing Officer hereby re-suspends the effectiveness of the tariff **through August 12, 2019**.

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED THAT:

The effective date of the proposed Thirteenth Revised Sheet No. 12-Riders-1 filed by Tennessee-American Water Company on November 16, 2018, is hereby re-suspended **through August 12, 2019**, or until further order of the Tennessee Public Utility Commission, whichever occurs sooner.
