## DIRECT TESTIMONY OF PATRICK MATTINGLY ON BEHALF OF ATMOS ENERGY CORPORATION

1	Q:	Please state your name and business address.
2	A:	My name is Patrick Mattingly. My business address is 3510 Coleman Road, Paducah,
3		Kentucky 42001.
4	Q:	By whom and in what capacity are you employed?
5	A:	I am employed by Atmos Energy Corporation, Kentucky/Mid-States Division ("Atmos
6		Energy" or "the Company") as Operations Supervisor for the Paducah, Kentucky area of
7		operations which includes Atmos Energy's operations in the City of Woodland Mills,
8		Tennessee.
9	Q:	Please describe your work history with Atmos Energy.
0	A:	I have been employed by Atmos Energy for 29 years. I began my career as a meter
1		reader and have held various positions in Atmos Energy with increasing responsibilities.
2		I have held my current position as Operations Supervisor since 2005.
3	Q:	Have you previously offered testimony in any regulatory proceedings?

transmission mains, and service lines. The majority of this pipe is located within the

public rights-of-way of Woodland Mills. Without access to these public rights-of-way,

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1		Aunos Energy could not adequatery maintain, replace and/or operate its distribution
2		system.
3	Q:	Has Atmos Energy operated a natural gas distribution system in Woodland Mills
4		for a number of years?
5	A:	Yes. Atmos Energy and its predecessor entity have operated for many years in
6		Woodland Mills under a franchise agreement with the City of Woodland Mills. The
7		franchise agreement City Ordinance No. 5 allowed Atmos Energy to operate a gas system
8		within Woodland Mills and to use the public rights of way of the City for its distribution
9		system and related plant and access thereto for a twenty year period.
10	Q:	Could you please explain the circumstances that caused a need for a new franchise
11		agreement between Atmos Energy and the City of Woodland Mills.
12	A:	Yes. Under § 65-26-101 of the Tennessee Code Annotated, Atmos Energy is required to
13		have the consent of the City of Woodland Mills, in the form of a municipal ordinance, in
14		order to enter onto the streets and alleys of Woodland Mills for the purpose of placing
15		maintaining, or expanding its natural gas distribution facilities. Atmos Energy and its
16		predecessor entity have been providing natural gas service to the City of Woodland Mills
17		for the last twenty years pursuant to the ordinance I have previously mentioned. As the
18	s	twenty year term of Ordinance No. 5 will expire in June 2019, Atmos Energy and the
19		City have entered into a new franchise agreement, Ordinance No. 2018-3, allowing
20		Atmos Energy to continue to serve the City of Woodland Mills into the future.
21	Q:	When did Atmos Energy begin pursuing a new franchise arrangement with the City

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of Woodland Mills?

1	A:	Atmos Energy and the City of Woodland Mills began discussions in fall 2018 and a
2		proposed new franchise ordinance followed from those discussions.
3	Q:	How does the new franchise agreement compare with the old one?
4	A:	The proposed franchise in substance extends the term of the current franchise for twenty
5		years. There is no franchise fee in the agreement.
6	Q:	Is Commission approval required for this new franchise agreement?
7	A:	Yes. Under § 65-4-107 of Tennessee Code Annotated, the new franchise agreement will
8		not be valid unless and until approved by this Commission.
9	Q:	What is the standard to be utilized by the Commission in determining whether to
10		approve the new franchise agreement?
11	A:	Under the statute, the Commission is authorized to approve the ordinance if it finds that it
12		"is necessary and proper for the public convenience and properly conserves the public
13		interest."
4	Q:	In your opinion, are the terms of the Woodland Mills franchise agreement necessary
5		and proper for the public convenience and in the public interest?
6	A:	Yes, on a number of grounds.
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8		First, the new franchise terms reflected in the new agreement will establish a long-term
9		arrangement through which the current and future residents, business enterprises and
20		governmental facilities located with the City of Woodland Mills will be able to receive,
21		under the supervisory jurisdiction of the Commission, the benefits of continuing natural
22		gas service provided by Atmos Energy for an extended period. This arrangement will

1 help ensure the continuing availability of high-quality natural gas service to the City of 2 Woodland Mills for the foreseeable future. 3 Second, the new franchise facilitates the provision of such natural gas service to the City 4 of Woodland Mills by an established and proven provider of that service well-known to 5 6 both the City of Woodland Mills and this Commission and possessing the requisite expertise, facilities, systems and gas supply and transportation assets necessary to provide 7 8 such service. 9 10 Third, the new franchise arrangement establishes adequate and proper mechanisms for access by Atmos Energy to public rights-of-way, new and existing customers, and its 11 12 distribution facilities. These mechanisms help to ensure that Atmos Energy is able to provide both adequate and efficient service and to comply with the requirements of this 13 14 Commission to ensure the safety and protection of residents and property within the City 15 of Woodland Mills. 16 17 Fourth, the various other protective provisions set forth in the new franchise arrangement provide useful and important tools for the City of Woodland Mills to ensure that its 18 citizens are benefited and not economically harmed by the activities of Atmos Energy 19 20 within the City of Woodland Mills. 21 22 Fifth, the new franchise arrangement provides an incentive for Atmos Energy to invest in infrastructure needed to provide improved and expanded service within the City of 23

1 Woodland Mills by ensuring that Atmos Energy will have the right to provide service within these areas for a sufficient period in order to permit Atmos Energy the opportunity 2 3 to recover the capital investment in such facilities under the rates approved by the Commission. 4 What are you asking the Commission to do in this proceeding? 5 O: 6 A: Based on the facts discussed above, we are asking the Commission to approve the new 7 franchise agreement between Atmos Energy and the City of Woodland Mills as reflected 8 in Exhibit 1 to the Petition in this matter. 9 Do you have anything further to add to your testimony? 0: Not at this time. 10 A:
