On February 2, 2022, pursuant to Tenn. Code Ann. § 7-59-301, *et seq.*, also known as the Competitive Cable and Video Services Act (“CCVSA”), Point Broadband Fiber Holding, LLC (“Point”) filed with the Tennessee Public Utility Commission (“Commission”) a *First Amendment to State Issued Certificate of Franchise Authority*. In its First Amendment, Point supplements certain municipalities and unincorporated areas within counties<sup>1</sup> previously described within its application filed July 30, 2019. Upon such filing, the Tennessee Public Utility Commission hereby issues the *First Amended Certificate of Franchise Authority*.
