**ORDER GRANTING NAVITAS MOTION FOR ADDITIONAL TIME UNTIL SEPTEMBER 28, 2020 TO  
FILE A RESPONSE**

This matter is before the Hearing Officer of the Tennessee Public Utility Commission (“Commission” or “TPUC”) for consideration of the *Motion by Navitas TN NG, LLC for Additional Time to File a Response to B&W Pipeline, LLC Motion to Dismiss Navitas Counterclaim* (“*Motion*”). On August 27, 2020, Navitas TN NG, LLC (“Navitas”) filed a *Motion* requesting an extension of time until September 28, 2020, to file a Response to the *Motion to Dismiss Counterclaim* filed by B&W Pipeline, LLC (“B&W”) on June 22, 2020. As grounds for its *Motion*, Navitas states that a case decided on June 17, 2020 by the Kentucky Public Service Commission (“KYPSC”) involved the parties to this docket and the rate surcharge set in the KYPSC docket directly impacts the current docket before the Commission. Navitas states that the parties are negotiating a settlement agreement and have one issue remaining to be resolved. The parties also need additional time once all of the issues are resolved to reduce the agreement to writing. According to Navitas, B&W does not oppose the *Motion*.

The Hearing Officer finds the *Motion* is well taken and should be granted.

**IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED THAT:**

1. The *Motion by Navitas TN NG, LLC for Additional Time to File a Response to B&W*

*Pipeline, LLC Motion to Dismiss Navitas Counterclaim* is **GRANTED**.

2. Navitas TN NG, LLC has until September 28, 2020, to file a Response to the *Motion to Dismiss Counterclaim* filed by B&W Pipeline, LLC.
