**ORDER RE-SUSPENDING TARIFF THROUGH JUNE 15, 2020**

---

This matter is before the Hearing Officer appointed by the voting panel of Commissioners of the Tennessee Public Utility Commission (“Commission” or “TPUC”) and designated by General Counsel to administer certain preliminary issues that may arise during the preparation of this matter for hearing before the Commission. On January 14, 2020, pursuant to Tenn. Code Ann. § 65-5-103 *et seq.*, Tennessee-American Water Company (“TAWC” or the “Company”) filed its *Petition* seeking approval of the proposed Production Costs and Other Pass-Throughs Rider percentage, along with the proposed tariffs.

Tenn. Code Ann. § 65-5-103(a) permits the Commission, pending a hearing and determination, to suspend any rate increase, change, or alteration for an initial period not to exceed three months from the proposed effective date of such increase, change, or alteration.<sup>1</sup> The Hearing Officer initially suspended the tariff through May 11, 2020; however, because the Commission's investigation, hearing, and final determination on the Company's proposed tariff cannot be completed by that date, the Hearing Officer hereby re-suspends the effectiveness of the tariff through June 15, 2020.
