ORDER ESTABLISHING PROCEDURAL SCHEDULE

This matter is before the Hearing Officer of the Tennessee Public Utility Commission (“Commission” or “TPUC”) to establish a procedural schedule for the orderly administration of these proceedings. At the request of the Hearing Officer, ENGIE Development, LLC (“ENGIE” or the “Petitioner”) and the Consumer Advocate Unit in the Financial Division of the Office of the Attorney General (“Consumer Advocate”), the parties in this matter, convened a status conference on April 2, 2020 in order to establish a procedural schedule in this docket. The goal and design of any procedural schedule is to efficiently move the proceedings forward to a hearing and final conclusion on the merits. - For all spreadsheets, a copy shall be filed in Excel format with working formulas intact. This includes spreadsheets that are exhibits to Pre-filed Testimony.

¹ The parties may waive hearing in this docket and submit the matter on brief. Should the parties request to proceed with the Hearing on this matter, due to the state of emergency declared by Governor Bill Lee in Executive Order 14 relative to the Coronavirus COVID-19 on March 12, 2020, a hearing in this matter will be conducted via electronic means. Details concerning access to the hearing will be published in the Notice of Hearing to be issued on a future date.
