ORDER SUSPENDING TARIFF THROUGH SEPTEMBER 14, 2020

This matter is before the Hearing Officer appointed by the voting panel of Commissioners of the Tennessee Public Utility Commission (“Commission” or “TPUC”) and designated by General Counsel to administer certain preliminary issues that may arise during the preparation of this matter for hearing before the Commission. On February 28, 2020, pursuant to Tenn. Code Ann. § 65-5-103 *et seq.*, Tennessee-American Water Company (“TAWC” or the “Company”) filed its *Petition in Support of the Calculation of the 2020 Capital Recovery Riders Reconciliation* (“*Petition*”).

Tenn. Code Ann. § 65-5-103(a) permits the Commission, pending a hearing and determination, to suspend any rate increase, change, or alteration for an initial period not to exceed three months from the proposed effective date of such increase, change, or alteration.¹ TAWC filed Supplemental Testimony of Elaine Chambers on August 3, 2020, along with a revised tariff with an effective date of August 10, 2020; however, because the Commission’s

investigation, hearing, and final determination on the Company's proposed tariff cannot be completed by that date, the Hearing Officer hereby suspends the effectiveness of the tariff through September 14, 2020.

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED THAT:

The effective date of the proposed TPUC No. 19 Twenty-First Revised Sheet No. 12-Riders-1 filed by Tennessee-American Water Company on August 3, 2020, is hereby suspended **through September 14, 2020**, or until further order of the Tennessee Public Utility Commission, whichever occurs sooner.
