## MOTION TO ALLOW WITNESS TO PARTICIPATE AT HEARING TELEPHONICALLY

The hearing in the above-captioned matter (the "Hearing") has been set by the Tennessee Public Utility Commission (the "Commission") for November 1, 2021, at 9:00 A.M. (CST), in Hearing Room G.201 of the Andrew Jackson State Office Building, 502 Deaderick Street, Nashville, Tennessee 37243. Piedmont Natural Gas Company, Inc. ("Piedmont" or the "Company") hereby moves the Commission to allow witness Pia K. Powers to participant in the Hearing telephonically. In support of its Motion, Piedmont respectfully shows unto the Commission as follows:

- 1. T.C.A. § 4-5-312 (c) provides:
- "(c) In the discretion of the administrative judge or hearing officer and agency members and by agreement of the parties, all or part of the hearing may be conducted by telephone, television or other electronic means, if each participant in the hearing has an opportunity to participate in, to hear, and, if technically feasible, to see the entire proceedings while taking place."
- 2. In accordance with the above-referenced statute, Piedmont respectfully requests that the witness for Piedmont, Pia K. Powers, who resides in Charlotte, North Carolina and currently experiences travel impediments due to a recent acute illness, be permitted to participate by telephone.
- 3. If this Motion is granted, the Company agrees that witness Powers' telephonic participation in the Hearing will be subject to the following conditions:

- a. The Company's attorney, Paul Davidson, Esq., shall appear personally at the Hearing to present and facilitate questioning of the witness.
- b. The Company is solely responsible for, and shall be required to, secure a properly licensed Notary Public in good standing in the State of the jurisdiction where the testimony is to be given, and who will be in the same physical location with the witness while she is providing the testimony or ratifying pre-filed testimony.
- c. The Notary Public obtained by the Company shall be duly authorized to administer the testimonial oath and shall do so during the Hearing and remain physically present with the witness at all times during the witness' testimony until such witness is excused from examination by the Commission or Hearing Officer.
- d. Following conclusion of the Hearing, the Notary Public shall prepare and sign an affidavit, which bears the official seal of the Notary Public, affirming: (1) the proven identity of the witness, (2) the fact that the Notary Public properly administered the testimonial oath to such person, and (3) that testimony given by the sworn witness was in accordance with the highest ethical and legal standards, as observed by the Notary Public. In addition, the testifying witness shall sign a conforming Witness Certification.
- e. The original Witness Certification and Notary Public Affidavit will be post-marked within five (5) days of the Hearing and received by the Hearing Officer via postage-paid U.S. Mail or overnight delivery. Should the required affirming documents not be received by the Hearing Officer as required above, the testimony of the witness may be stricken from the record.

WHEREFORE, Piedmont Natural Gas Company, Inc., respectfully requests that the Commission grant this motion allowing Piedmont witness Pia K. Powers to participate telephonically as described herein.
