**ORDER GRANTING PERMISSION TO PLEAD AND PRACTICE PRO HAC VICE**

This matter is before the Hearing Officer upon the *Motion to Appear Pro Hac Vice* (“*Motion*”), filed by Rachel C. Procaccini, attorney for the Consumer Advocate Unit in the Financial Division of the Office of the Tennessee Attorney General (“Consumer Advocate”). The *Motion* was filed on March 30, 2021 and seeks permission for Ms. Procaccini to appear on behalf of the Consumer Advocate in the above-captioned proceeding.

The *Motion* states Ms. Procaccini is a licensed attorney in good standing and admitted to practice law in the States of North Carolina and Florida, and further, that no disciplinary actions or investigations are pending against her.<sup>1</sup> The *Motion* is accompanied by an affidavit from Ms. Procaccini in which she agrees to subject herself to the jurisdiction of the Board of Professional Responsibility of the Supreme Court of Tennessee and the Tennessee Public Utility Commission (“Commission”) and agrees to be bound by the rules governing the conduct of attorneys appearing before the Commission.
