**ORDER GRANTING AUTHORITY TO RESELL INTEREXCHANGE
TELECOMMUNICATIONS SERVICES IN TENNESSEE**

This matter came before Chairman Kenneth C. Hill, Vice Chairman Herbert H. Hilliard, Commissioner Robin L. Morrison, Commissioner John Hie, and Commissioner David F. Jones of the Tennessee Public Utility Commission (the “Commission” or “TPUC”), the voting panel of Commissioners assigned in this matter, during a regularly scheduled Commission Conference held on July 13, 2021 to consider the *Application of GigaMonster Networks, LLC for a Certificate of Convenience and Necessity to Provide Resold Competing and Local Exchange and Interexchange Telecommunications Services in Tennessee* (the “*Application*”) filed by GigaMonster Networks, LLC (“GigaMonster” or the “Company”) on March 2, 2021. In its *Application*, GigaMonster seeks authority to provide resold interexchange telecommunications services within the State of Tennessee.

Based upon careful consideration of the *Application* and of the record in this matter, the panel found that the Company has met all the requirements for certification and the requirements of Tenn. Comp. R. & Regs. 1220-04-02-.57, which was promulgated pursuant to, *inter alia*, Tenn. Code Ann. §§ 65-2-102 and 65-4-201, and voted unanimously that GigaMonster should be authorized to resell interexchange telecommunications services in Tennessee.

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED THAT:

1. GigaMonster Networks, LLC is authorized to resell interexchange telecommunications services in the state of Tennessee.
2. This Order shall remain in effect until further order of this Commission.
3. This Order shall be retained as proof of certification with this Commission and may be used to obtain the appropriately tariffed access line from Commission authorized telecommunications service providers.
4. Any person who is aggrieved by the Commission's decision in this matter may file a Petition for Reconsideration with the Commission within fifteen days from the date of this Order.
5. Any person who is aggrieved by the Commission's decision in this matter has the right to judicial review by filing a Petition for Review in the Tennessee Court of Appeals, Middle Section, within sixty days from the date of this Order.
