APPLICATION FOR A CERTIFICATE TO PROVIDE COMPETING LOCAL EXCHANGE AND INTEREXCHANGE TELECOMMUNICATIONS SERVICES

Pursuant to applicable Tennessee Statues and the Rules and Regulations of the Tennessee Public Utility Commission ("Commission") and Section 253 of the Federal Telecommunications Act of 1996 ("Telecommunications Act of 1996"), NGA 911, L.L.C. ("NGA 911" or "Applicant"), by and through its counsel respectfully requests that the Commission grant NGA 911 authority to provide competing local exchange and interexchange telecommunications services throughout the State of Tennessee in order to provide emergency call routing, transport, and related functionalities to state and municipal governmental agencies to support public service answering point ("PSAP") operations. Applicant is willing and able to adhere to all applicable Commission polices, rules, and orders pertaining to the provision of competing local exchange and interexchange telecommunications services as specified in TCA §65-4-201.

The State of Tennessee has adopted a policy of allowing competition in the local and long-distance telecommunications markets, recognizing that it is in the public interest to develop effective competition to ensure that all consumers will have access to high quality, low cost, and

innovative telecommunications services. The Telecommunications Act of 1996 also seeks to promote competition and reduce regulation in order to secure lower prices and higher quality telecommunications services for American consumers. Both goals will be promoted by granting this Application.

2. Organizational Chart of Corporate Structure: Include any pertinent acquisition or merger information.

Attached as **Exhibit A** is an organizational chart of the Company's corporate structure. Although formed in 2016, Applicant did not become an operating entity until 2018 when, in connection with a further capitalization of the company, NGA 911, Inc. contributed substantially all of its assets to Applicant and became Applicant's majority owner. Otherwise, there is no applicable pertinent acquisition or merger information to detail.

3. <u>Corporate Information</u>

Applicant is a duly formed limited liability company, organized under the laws of the State of California. A copy of Applicant's Articles of Organization are attached as **Exhibit B**. Applicant is a privately held company and does not have a parent company or affiliates; however, NGA 911, Inc. is the majority owner of Applicant. Other than NGA 911, Inc. there are no other persons, entities or direct owners with a 10% or greater interest in the Applicant. A copy of Applicant's Certificate of Authority to transact business as a foreign limited liability company in Tennessee is attached as **Exhibit C**.

4. Managerial, Technical and Financial Qualifications

NGA 911 possesses the managerial, technical and financial ability to provide telecommunications services in the State of Tennessee as demonstrated below:

A. Managerial Qualifications

Applicant has the managerial and technical qualifications necessary to provide the proposed services in Tennessee. NGA 911 is managed by a highly skilled team with substantial expertise and experience in public safety communications, related engineering, and business management. Its founder and CEO is Don Ferguson. Mr. Ferguson is joined by Bill Munn, Ph.D., who serves as the company's Vice President; Darold Whitmer, Senior Vice President, Strategic Relationships; Michelle Bland, ENP, who is the Chief Operating Officer; and Ed Vea, who is the Chief Technology Officer. Biographies of key management personnel of Applicant, who are responsible for the Applicant's operations, are attached as **Exhibit D**. These biographies reflect management's substantial communications

industry experience and expertise, and demonstrate that the Applicant possesses significant managerial and technical expertise operating a variety of communications services across multiple jurisdictions. Thus, NGA 911 possesses the managerial and technical qualifications necessary to operate as a competing local telecommunications company in Tennessee, consistent with the Commission's requirements. There are no officers located within Tennessee. All officers and directors may be reached at Applicant's principal place of business provided above.

B. General Technical Qualifications

NGA 911 will satisfy the minimum standards established by the Commission. To the extent required, Applicant will file and maintain tariffs in the matter prescribed by the Commission and will meet minimum basic local standards, including quality of service and billing standards required of all Local Exchange Carriers regulated by the Commission. Applicant will not require Customers to purchase CPE that cannot be used with the Incumbent Local Exchange Carrier's systems. As noted in the biographies provided in **Exhibit D**, Applicant's operations will be overseen by a well-qualified management team with substantial telecommunications experience and technical expertise.

Applicant currently holds authority or is registered to provide intrastate telecommunications services in the following jurisdictions: California, Florida, Georgia, Hawaii, Idaho, Iowa, Louisiana, Minnesota, Missouri, Montana, Nebraska, Nevada, New Jersey, Oklahoma, Pennsylvania, South Carolina, South Dakota, Texas, Utah, Virginia, West Virginia and Wisconsin. Additionally, NGA 911 is in the process of seeking authorization and has applications or registrations pending in the States of Arizona, Illinois and New York and is in the process of seeking such authorization in other states. Applicant has not been denied authority to provide telecommunications services in any state, nor has any state

revoked the authority of Applicant to operate therein. Applicant does not hold any authority from the Federal Communications Commission.

C. Financial Qualifications and Surety Bond

The Applicant has sufficient financial resources to initiate and maintain the services and related operations in Tennessee as proposed in this Application. Applicant is providing under seal financial information for NGA 911 as Confidential Exhibit E, which demonstrates the financial resources available to provide the proposed telecommunications services in Tennessee. Because Applicant is a privately held company, Applicant requests that the financial statements appended hereto as **Confidential Exhibit E** be treated as Confidential. Included with Confidential Exhibit E are audited financial statements for 2019, unaudited financial statements for the period ended December 30, 2020; and projected financial statements for a three year period of 2021, 2022 and 2023. The Confidential exhibits are marked "CONFIDENTIAL" and are being filed as a separate document and Applicant requests that it not to be made part of the public record. NGA 911's financials nor their projected financials reflect any revenues or expenses associated with reciprocal compensation. Upon request, this Application will be supplemented with a capital expenditures budget for a threeyear period.

Since Applicant does not own or operate equipment facilities in Tennessee with a value of more than five million dollars (\$5,000,000), T.C.A. § 65-4-125 requires the filing of a surety bond in the amount of twenty thousand dollars (\$20,000) to secure the payment of any monetary sanctions imposed against NGA 911 in any proceeding brought under this title or the Consumer Telemarketing Protection Act of 1990. Applicant will provide the applicable Surety Bond in the amount of \$20,000 prior to beginning operations in Tennessee.

5. Proposed Service Area and Description of Services

NGA 911 seeks authority to provide telecommunications services and operate throughout the State of Tennessee and therefore, seeks statewide authority in order to provide emergency call routing, transport, and related functionalities to state and municipal governmental agencies to support public service answering point ("PSAP") operations. While NGA 911 primarily intends to provide a NG9-1-1 solution that utilizes a highly efficient path to achieve end-to-end IP call handling for NG9-1-1 services, Applicant also will support and deliver legacy E911 and 9-1-1 services for carriers and PSAPs that have not yet transitioned to NG9-1-1 services. NGA 911's incremental deployment, patented and patent pending services are designed to safely transition legacy 9-1-1 systems to the latest NG9-1-1 technology available. Applicant seeks to comply with the State of Tennessee's regulatory requirements so NGA 911's advanced technology can be applied and offered to modernize the state's 9-1-1 system. The anticipated impact of NGA 911's technology is the improvement in the operation, function and downtime of 9-1-1 in the state at a manageable cost.

Applicant proposes to provide these services primarily through facilities to be leased from a variety of telecommunications carriers and other providers, but may also use its own facilities. NGA 911 will use existing network infrastructure, including data centers, interconnection facilities, fiber optic lines, poles, conduits, ducts and other access methods, where appropriate to provide its services. Should additional access or network deployment be necessary, NGA 911 will obtain necessary approvals through the appropriate permitting agency.

NGA 911 will rely on a number of different network and infrastructure facilities for the provisioning of a combination of both legacy 9-1-1 services and IP-based services (NG9-1-1). These can be characterized as Ingress, ESInet, Cloud, Direct Connect, and PSAP-based. Applicant's NG9-1-1 solution utilizes a diverse, redundant, secure IP infrastructure. Facilities and nodes are geographically diverse and are equipped with physically redundant data communications and power equipment that allow for continuous operation and reliability. Applicant's NG9-1-1 Emergency Services provides a secure, IP-based, open-standards system comprised of hardware, software, data, Next Generation Core Service (NGCS) Functional Elements (FE), and operational policies and procedures.

With its cloud-based NG9-1-1 services, Applicant has created an infrastructure that stays ahead of cyber threats, scales on demand, and employs numerous failover strategies. It enables multiple access points to integrate new technology through innovative collaborative techniques, with no single point of failure. It allows for the seamless integration of PSAP processes that translate into more accurate call routing, faster call processing times, increased resource efficiency, quicker response times, and better decision making.

Applicant also will be able to process and transport calls from the legacy 9-1-1 system. For wireless and wirelines service providers using circuit-base, SS7 signaling, Applicant will use a Legacy Network Gateway to convert signaling to Internet-Protocol before routing and delivering to the appropriate PSAP. For wireless, wireline, and voice over IP (VoIP) service providers using IP based multimedia SIP signaling, Applicant offers aggregation and routing services that comply with NG9-1-1 standards to deliver calls to the appropriate PSAP.

6. Types of Telecommunications Service To Be Provided

As noted in response to Question 5, NGA 911 intends to provide emergency call routing, transport, and related functionalities to state and municipal governmental agencies to support public service answering point ("PSAP") operations. NGA 911 will not directly serve end-user customers. NGA 911 does not have plans to provide retail switched voice services, including dial-tone to end-user customers in Tennessee. In the event that Applicant decides to expand its services to include voice services as dictated by marketplace conditions, Applicant will seek such authority at that time and will provide those services required by Rule 1220-4-8-.04(3)(b).

7. Repair and Maintenance

NGA 911 will perform network and equipment maintenance necessary to ensure compliance with any quality of service requirements and will comply with all applicable Commission rules, regulations and standards and will provide safe, reliable and high-quality telecommunications services within Tennessee. Customers with complaints or inquiries should contact the Company toll free at 877-899-8337, via email at regulatory@nga911.com or by mail to the Company's principal place of business at 8383 Wilshire Blvd., Suite 800, Beverly Hills, CA 90211. The contact person knowledgeable about the Applicants ongoing operations in Tennessee is Don Ferguson, Chief Executive Officer.

8. Small and Minority-Owned Telecommunications Business Participation Plan

As required pursuant to TCA § 65-5-112, attached as **Exhibit F** is Applicant's plan for purchasing goods and services from Small and Minority telecommunications businesses and information on programs to provide technical assistance to such businesses.

9. Toll Dialing Parity Plan

Not applicable. Applicant does not intend to provide voice services at this time.

10. Notice Requirements

Applicant has served notice of this Application to the eighteen (18) incumbent local exchange telephone Companies, as well as the Consumer Advocate and Protection Division of the Office of the Tennessee Attorney General with a statement regarding the Company's intention to operate throughout the State of Tennessee. Attached as **Exhibit G** is the Notice and a Certificate of Service confirming compliance.

13. <u>Miscellaneous and Supporting Documentation</u>

- B. Applicant reserves the right to collection deposits from its Customers and the requirements will be included in any proposed tariffs that NGA 911 files with the Commission.

- C. As of the filing of this Application, NGA 911 has not been the subject of any complaints in any of the states within which Applicant is certified and currently providing service.
- D. Subsequent to the approval of this Application, NGA 911 will elect to operate under market regulation pursuant to T.C.A. Section 65-5-109 enacted in May 2009. Since Applicant does not intend provide switched access services, it will not file or maintain tariffs with the Commission but rather will provide its services pursuant to individual contracts with its customers.

In conclusion, this application demonstrates that NGA 911 possesses the technical, financial and managerial resources to provide facilities-based and resold local exchange and interexchange service in the State of Tennessee. Furthermore, granting this Application will promote the public interest by increasing the level of competition in the Tennessee telecommunications market. Ultimately, competition will compel all telecommunications service providers to operate more efficiently and with resulting reduced prices for consumers. These benefits work to maximize the public interest by providing continuing incentives for carriers to reduce costs while simultaneously promoting the availability of potentially desirable services.

Wherefore, NGA 911 respectfully requests that the Commission grant a Certificate of Convenience and Necessity to provide competing telecommunications service provider and authority to provide telecommunications services throughout the State of Tennessee in the service areas of the Incumbent Local Exchange Carriers that do not enjoy a rural exemption under Section 251(f) of the Telecommunications Act of 1996. For the reasons stated above, NGA 911's provision of these services would promote the public interest by providing high-quality service at competitive prices and by creating greater economic incentives for the development and improvement for all competing providers.

Organizational Chart



PRE-FILED TESTIMONY OF DON FERGUSON

I, Don Ferguson, do hereby testify as follows in support of the application of NGA 911, L.L.C. ("NGA 911") for a Certificate of convenience and necessity as a competing telecommunications services provider to provide telecommunication services throughout the State of Tennessee.

Q: Please state your full name, business address, and position.

A: My name is Don Ferguson. My business address is 8332 Wilshire Blvd., Suite 800, Beverly Hills, CA 90211. My telephone number is 213-284-1480.

Q: Please briefly describe your duties.

A: I am the President and Chief Executive Officer of NGA 911 L.L.C. ("NGA 911" or "the Company"). In conjunction with the Board, I develop NGA 911's business strategy. I oversee the implementation of the Company's long- and short-term plan, filings, docketed proceedings, and interconnection agreements with incumbent local exchange carriers ("ILECs"), wireless carriers, and Voice over Internet Protocol ("VoIP") service providers.

Q: Please describe your business experience and educational background.

A: I have 25 years of experience in technology leadership positions. I have been the President and Chief Executive Officer of NGA 911 since 2015. Under my direction, NGA 911 has registered or filed applications and has been granted authorization to provide its services in California, Florida, Georgia, Hawaii, Idaho, Iowa, Louisiana, Minnesota Missouri, Montana, Nebraska, Nevada, New Jersey, Oklahoma, Pennsylvania, South Carolina, South Dakota, Texas, Utah, Virginia, West Virginia and Wisconsin. NGA 911 has filings pending in Arizona, Illinois and New York. My prior experience includes being the Chief Executive Officer for MobileTREC (Mobile Time Response Emergency Call), from 2008 to 2015. At MobileTREC, I supervised Research and Development and Technology Services and developed cloud-based, and mobile consumer technology. I was a Consultant with Strategic Business Group from 2004 to 2015. I had consulting engagements where I developed and executed mobile, internet, and social technology plans. As Director of Information Technology, from 2000 to 2004, I built and launched enterprise internet software. I was the Director of Information Technology at Open Sesame Systems from 1996 to 1999.

Q: Are all statements in NGA 911's application true and correct to the best of your knowledge, information and belief?

A: Yes.

Q: Please describe the current corporate structure of NGA 911.

A: NGA 911 is a duly formed limited liability company, organized under the laws of the State of California. A copy of Applicant's Articles of Organization are included with the Application as **Exhibit B**. Applicant is privately held and does not have a parent company or affiliates; however, NGA 911, Inc. is the majority owner of Applicant. Other than NGA 911, Inc. there are no other persons, entities or direct owners with a 10% or greater interest in NGA 911.

Q: Does NGA 911 possess the requisite managerial, financial, and technical abilities to provide the services for which it has applied for authority?

A: Yes. NGA 911 has the managerial, technical and financial qualifications necessary to provide the proposed services in Tennessee.

Q: Please describe NGA 911's financial qualifications.

A: NGA 911 has sufficient financial resources to initiate and maintain the services and related operations in Tennessee as proposed in this Application. Applicant is providing *under seal* financial information for NGA 911 as **Confidential Exhibit E**, which demonstrates the financial resources available to provide the proposed telecommunications services in Tennessee. Included with **Confidential Exhibit E** are audited financial statements for 2019, unaudited financial statements for the period ended December 30, 2020; and projected financial statements for a three-year period of 2021, 2022 and 2023.

Q: Please describe NGA 911's managerial and technical qualifications.

A: NGA 911 has the managerial qualifications necessary to provide the proposed services in Tennessee, as NGA 911 is managed by a highly skilled team with substantial expertise and experience in public safety communications, related engineering, and business management and are responsible for the Applicant's operations. The biographies included with the Application as **Exhibit D** reflects management's substantial communications industry experience and expertise, and demonstrate that the Applicant possesses significant managerial and technical expertise operating a variety of communications services across multiple jurisdictions. Thus, NGA 911 possesses the managerial and technical qualifications necessary to operate as a competing local telecommunications company in Tennessee, consistent with the Commission's requirements. NGA 911's operations will be overseen by a

well-qualified management team with substantial telecommunications experience and technical expertise.

O: What services will NGA 911 offer?

A: NGA 911 seeks authority to provide telecommunications services and operate throughout the State of Tennessee in order to provide emergency call routing, transport, and related functionalities to state and municipal governmental agencies to support public service answering point ("PSAP") operations. While NGA 911 primarily intends to provide a NG9-1-1 solution that utilizes a highly efficient path to achieve end-to-end IP call handling for NG9-1-1 services, Applicant also will support and deliver legacy E911 and 9-1-1 services for carriers and PSAPs that have not yet transitioned to NG9-1-1 services. NGA 911's incremental deployment, patented and patent pending services are designed to safely transition legacy 9-1-1 systems to the latest NG9-1-1 technology available. Applicant seeks to comply with the State of Tennessee's regulatory requirements so NGA 911's advanced technology can be applied and offered to modernize the state's 9-1-1 system. The anticipated impact of NGA 911's technology is the improvement in the operation, function and downtime of 9-1-1 in the state at a manageable cost. NGA 911 will rely on a number of different network and infrastructure facilities for the provisioning of a combination of both legacy 9-1-1 services and IP-based services (NG9-1-1). These can be characterized as Ingress, ESInet, Cloud, Direct Connect, and PSAP-based. Applicant's NG9-1-1 solution utilizes a diverse, redundant, secure IP infrastructure. Facilities and nodes are geographically diverse and are equipped with physically redundant data communications and power equipment that allow for continuous operation and reliability. Applicant's NG9-1-1 Emergency Services provides a secure, IP-based, open-standards system comprised of

hardware, software, data, Next Generation Core Service (NGCS) Functional Elements (FE), and operational policies and procedures. With its cloud-based NG9-1-1 services, Applicant has created an infrastructure that stays ahead of cyber threats, scales on demand, and employs numerous failover strategies. It enables multiple access points to integrate new technology through innovative collaborative techniques, with no single point of failure. It allows for the seamless integration of PSAP processes that translate into more accurate call routing, faster call processing times, increased resource efficiency, quicker response times, and better decision making.

Q: Will NGA 911 offer service to all consumers within its service area?

A: NGA 911 does not have plans to provide retail switched voice services, including dial tone to end-user customers in Tennessee. NGA 911 will offer emergency call routing, transport, and related functionalities to all state and municipal governmental agencies in the state of Tennessee.

Q: Does NGA 911 plan to offer local exchange telecommunications services in areas served by any incumbent local exchange telephone company with fewer than 100,000 total access lines?

A: NGA 911 is requesting authority to provide services throughout the State of Tennessee. However, NGA 911 does not have plans to provide retail switched voice services, including dial tone. The services proposed by NGA 911 to provide emergency call routing, transport, and related functionalities to state and municipal governmental agencies to support PSAP operations may well include agencies and businesses that are located in areas served by an incumbent local exchange telephone company with fewer than 100,000 total access lines.

Q: Will the granting of a certificate of convenience and necessity to NGA 911 serve the public interest?

A: Granting this Application will promote the public interest by increasing the level of competition in the Tennessee telecommunications market. Ultimately, competition will compel all exchange telecommunications service providers to operate more efficiently and with resulting reduced prices for consumers. These benefits work to maximize the public interest by providing continuing incentives for carriers to reduce costs while simultaneously promoting the availability of potentially desirable services. NGA 911's provision of these services would promote the public interest by providing high-quality service at competitive prices and by creating greater economic incentives for the development and improvement for all competing providers.

Q: Does NGA 911 intend to comply with all TPUC rules, statues, and orders pertaining to the provision of telecommunications services in Tennessee, including those for disconnection and reconnection of service?

A: Yes, to the extent applicable. However, NGA 911 does not have plans to provide retail switched voice services, including dial tone to customers in Tennessee.

Q: Has any state ever denied NGA 911 or one of its affiliates authorization to provide intrastate service?

A: No. NGA 911 has not been denied authority to provide telecommunications services in any state or jurisdiction.

Q: Has any state ever revoked the certification of NGA 911 or one of its affiliates?

A: No. NGA 911 has not had its authority to provide telecommunications services in any state, revoked.

Q: Has NGA 911 or one of its affiliates ever been investigated or sanctioned by any regulatory authority for service or billing irregularities?

A: No. NGA 911 has not been the subject of any investigations nor sanctioned by any regulatory authority for service or billing irregularities.

Q: Who is knowledgeable about NGA 911's operations and will serve as NGA 911's regulatory and customer service contact?
