ORDER GRANTING PERMISSION TO PLEAD AND PRACTICE PRO HAC VICE

Upon review, the Hearing Officer finds that the *Motion* and affidavit comply with Rule 19 of the Rules of the Tennessee Supreme Court and Tenn. Comp. R. & Reg. 1220-1-2-.04(7).
