**NOTICE OF AMENDMENT TO INTERCONNECTION  
AGREEMENT DEEMED APPROVED**

This Amendment to the Interconnection Agreement (the “Amendment”) negotiated between Bellsouth Telecommunications, LLC d/b/a AT&T Tennessee and Metropolitan Telecommunications of Tennessee, Inc. (“MetTel”) was filed with the Tennessee Public Utility Commission (the “Commission”) on December 27, 2021.<sup>1</sup> The Amendment was negotiated pursuant to 47 U.S.C. §§ 251 and 252. The Amendment has been reviewed, and no portion discriminates against a telecommunications carrier that is not a party to the agreement.

A Notice was filed by the Commission on March 11, 2022 advising that the Amendment would be deemed approved by the Commission within ten days of the filing of the Notice unless an objection to the Amendment was filed with the Commission. No objection to the Amendment has been received by the Commission.

Pursuant to the Notice and absent any objection having been filed with the Commission, the Amendment is approved effective as of March 21, 2022.
