as they become a part of a new community. She is also looking forward to the business the new Bristol Casino, which will be only a few minutes away from the Red Pepper, will bring.

“New place, new community. So, that’s a big excitement, and then with [the] casino coming, that’s another excitement,” Meenu Singh said. “Everybody has given us so much love, so I think it will be really good.”

The Singhs have set their sights on opening the Red Pepper by Friday, May 20, and are only waiting on the arrival of a walk-in freezer. Sunny Singh spoke about how the couple ended up spending

almost double what they had originally budgeted for the restaurant due to the ongoing construction and kitchen supply-chain shortages.

“Everything is more expensive, and as soon as we started doing it [building the restaurant], everything was going up every single day,” Sunny Singh said. “We almost spent like two, three times more than we thought of.”

As they wait for the arrival of the walk-in freezer, Sunny Singh identified the hiring of the restaurant’s staff as the biggest challenge ahead of them.

“It’s very hard to find people, but we’re in the process of hiring. So, hopefully, we’ll get the full staff,” Sunny Singh said. He highlighted that he is looking to hire 15 people.

Dr. Meenu Singh, who works full time as a physi-

cian, encourages Bristol residents who have never tried Indian Cuisine to come to the Red Pepper and try the buffet, where they will be able to discover what dishes they enjoy. She also addressed the erroneous idea that most people who have not tried Indian cuisine have about it.

“They can try a small amount with the buffet to see what they will like, which one [dish] will please them better, and that’s how they will learn about Indian food,” Dr. Meenu Singh said. “Most people, they think Indian food is spicy. It’s not spicy. It’s flavorful. It can be made spicy if you want spicy.”

The Red Pepper will be open Tuesday through Sunday from 11 a.m. to 2:30 pm for lunch and 5 p.m. to 10 p.m. for dinner.

shows the high stakes of Tuesday’s election, when seven candidates are seeking the Republican nomination for the seat held by retiring GOP Sen. Rob Portman. Democrats see the race as one of their best chances nationally to flip a seat in the midterm elections, while Republicans remain optimistic about their chances of holding a seat in a state that has swung to the right under Trump’s influence.

The primary has been heated from the start, with nearly all the Republicans in the race competing for Trump’s endorsement — a prize that eventually went to Vance, the author of “Hillbilly Elegy.” At the time of the endorsement, Vance was trailing in the polls, and the race is seen as one of the first big tests of Trump’s enduring influence among Republican voters.

But at a rally in Nebraska on Sunday, Trump seemed to undercut his support for Vance by mixing up his name with that of another candidate in the race.

thing about me, but he’s made up for it in spades,” Trump said of Vance’s past criticism, adding that he had “studied the debates” and “studied everybody” and determined that “JD’s the one whose going to win.”

Cleveland investment banker Mike Gibbons, a GOP contender in Ohio, had seized on Trump’s mistake as an opportunity to disparage Vance.

“Quite a ringing endorsement, eh?” he said in an email blast Sunday night, saying Vance is “clearly irrelevant” to Trump.

Gibbons’ final push included an online event featuring Paul, the senator from Kentucky, while Mandel campaigned with Texas’ Cruz on Friday and Saturday and with fellow military veterans Monday.

Meanwhile, Portman continued to campaign for Jane Timken, a former chair of the Ohio Republican Party, who has pointed to the strength of her grassroots network headed into Tuesday’s vote.

Vance campaigned over the weekend with Hawley, Gaetz and Greene, a trio

of strident Trump allies who are among the party’s most hard-right lawmakers. They portrayed Vance as a Washington outsider who will take on the establishment and stand up for average working Ohioans.

Vance was slammed for his decision to appear with Gaetz, who is embroiled in a federal sex trafficking investigation, although he has not been charged and denied wrongdoing. Vance said that being accused of a crime these days “is very often more about corrupt law enforcement than it is about anything anybody’s actually done.”

Rival candidate Matt Dolan, a state senator and former assistant state attorney general, rebuked Vance for the statement, as did one of Dolan’s top supporters, former Ohio Attorney General Betty Montgomery.

“The fact that JD is more inclined to defend a man being investigated for sex trafficking than our brave police officers and sheriffs, clearly proves he is unfit to serve as Ohio’s next U.S. senator,” Montgomery, a four-time state officeholder, said in a statement.

# Supreme Court rules against Boston in Christian flag case

WASHINGTON — A unanimous Supreme Court ruled Monday that Boston violated the free speech rights of a conservative activist when it refused his request to fly a Christian flag on a flagpole outside City Hall.

Justice Stephen Breyer wrote for the court that the city discriminated against the activist, Harold Shurtleff, because of his “religious viewpoint,” even though it had routinely approved applications for the use of one of the three flagpoles outside City Hall that fly the U.S., Massachusetts and Boston flags.

Occasionally, the city takes down its own permanent and temporary hoists another flag.

Shurtleff and his Camp Constitution wanted to fly a white banner with a red cross on the blue background in the upper left corner, called the Christian flag, to mark Constitution Day, Sept. 17, in 2017.

The city had approved 284 consecutive applications to fly flags, usually those of other nations, before it rejected Shurtleff’s because it was a Christian flag. The city said he could fly a different banner, but Shurtleff refused, and lower courts upheld the city’s decision.

But the high court said the lower courts and the city were wrong. The case hinged on whether the flag-flying is an act of the government, in which case Boston can do whatever it wants, or

private parties like Shurtleff, Breyer wrote.

“Finally, we look at the extent to which Boston actively controlled these flag raisings and shaped the messages the flags sent. The answer, it seems, is not at all. And that is the most salient feature of this case,” Breyer wrote in an opinion that also riffed on the brutalist architectural style of Boston’s City Hall and the Siena, Italy-inspired 7-acre plaza on which it sits.

Breyer wrote that “the city’s lack of meaningful involvement in the selection of flags or the crafting of their messages leads us to classify the flag raisings as private, not government, speech — though nothing pre-

vents Boston from changing its policies going forward.”

The city has said that in the event of a loss at the Supreme Court, it probably will change its policy to take more control of what flags can fly.

Shurtleff is a former organizer with the John Birch Society and has used his Camp Constitution website to question the Jan. 6 insurrection at the U.S. Capitol, the outcome of the 2020 election that put President Joe Biden in office, the efficacy of COVID-19 vaccines and even who was behind the Sept. 11 attacks.

None of that was at issue at the high court.

The case is *Shurtleff v. Boston*, 20-1800.

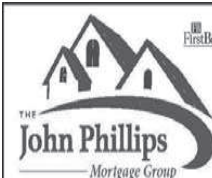

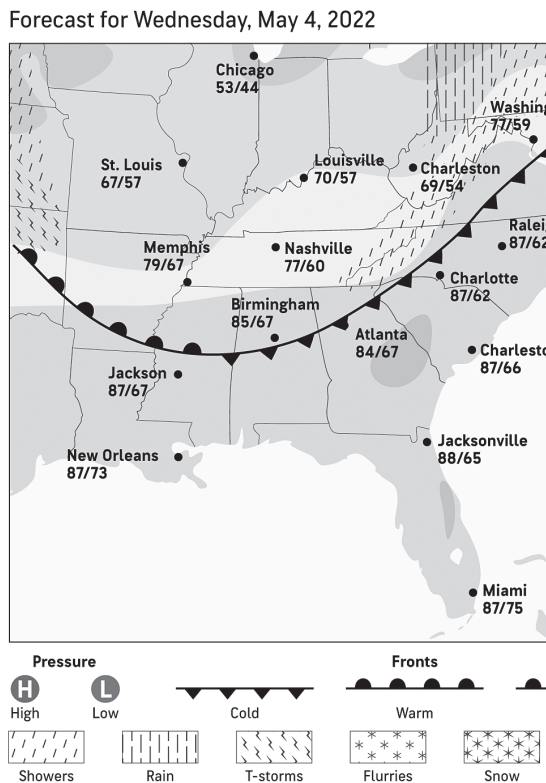

**Your dog’s personality may have  
little to do with its breed**

WASHINGTON (AP) — Research confirms what dog  
lovers know — every pup is truly an individual.

Many of the popular stereotypes about the behavior  
of golden retrievers, poodles or schnauzers, for example,  
aren’t supported by science, according to a new study.

“There is a huge amount of behavioral variation in ev-  
ery breed, and at the end of the day, every dog really is an  
individual,” said study co-author and University of Mas-  
sachusetts geneticist Elinor Karlsson.

She said pet owners love to talk about their dog’s per-  
sonality, as illustrated by some owners at a New York dog  
park.

Elizabeth Kelly said her English springer spaniel was  
“friendly, but she’s also kind of the queen bee.” Suly Ortiz  
described her yellow Lab as “really calm, lazy and shy.”

And Rachel Kim’s mixed-breed dog is “a lot of differ-  
ent dogs, personality wise — super independent, really  
affectionate with me and my husband, but pretty, pretty  
suspicious of other people, other dogs.”

That kind of enthusiasm from pet owners inspired  
Karlsson’s latest scientific inquiry. She wanted to know to  
what extent are behavioral patterns inherited — and how  
much are dog breeds associated with distinctive and pre-  
dictable behaviors?

The answer: While physical traits such as a greyhound’s  
long legs or a Dalmatian’s spots are clearly inherited,  
breed is not a strong predictor of any individual dog’s per-  
sonality.

The researchers’ work, published Thursday in the jour-  
nal Science, marshals a massive dataset to reach these con-  
clusions — the most ever compiled, said Adam Boyko, a  
geneticist at Cornell University, who was not involved in the  
study.

Dogs became humanity’s best friend more than 14,000  
years ago, as the only animal domesticated before the ad-  
vent of agriculture.

But the concept of dog breeds is much more recent.  
Around 160 years ago, people began to selectively breed  
dogs to have certain consistent physical traits, like coat  
texture and color and ear shape.

The researchers surveyed more than 18,000 dog owners  
and analyzed the genomes of about 2,150 of their dogs to  
look for patterns.

They found that some behaviors — such as howling,  
pointing and showing friendliness to human strangers —  
do have at least some genetic basis. But that inheritance  
isn’t strictly passed down along breed lines.

For example, they found golden retrievers that don’t re-  
trieve, said co-author Kathryn Lord, who studies animal  
behavior with Karlsson.

Some breeds, such as huskies and beagles, may show a  
greater tendency to howl. But many of these dogs don’t, as  
both the owner survey and genetic data showed.

The researchers could find no genetic basis for aggres-  
sive behaviors nor a link to specific breeds.

“The correlation between dog behavior and dog breed  
is much lower than most expected,” said Jeff Kidd, a ge-  
neticist at the University of Michigan, who had no role in  
the research.

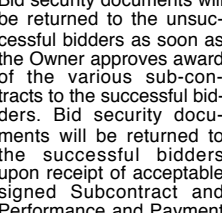

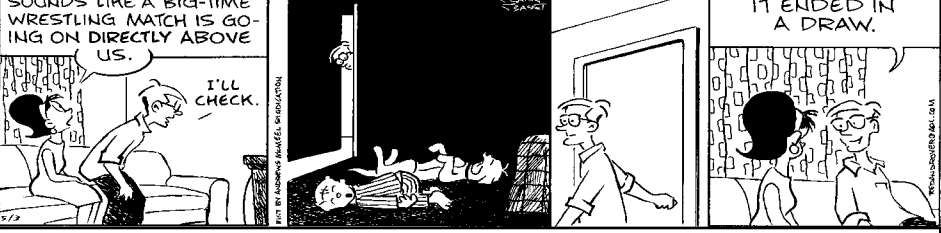

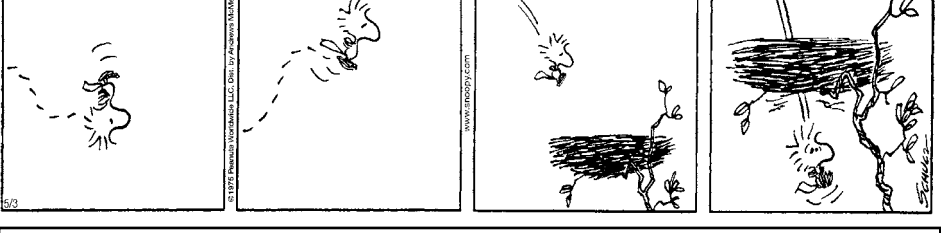
