ORDER OPENING A RULEMAKING PROCEEDING TO PROMULGATE RULES TO INCORPORATE REFERENCES FOR UNSOLICITED TEXT MESSAGES

This matter came before the Tennessee Public Utility Commission with all Commissioners voting, during a regularly scheduled Commission Conference held on May 8, 2023, to consider opening a rulemaking proceeding to promulgate rules to incorporate references for unsolicited text messages. ¹

On April 4, 2023, Governor Lee signed into law Public Chapter 126, which, effective July 1, 2023, amends Tenn. Code Ann. § 65-4-401 prohibiting unsolicited telephone calls to include and incorporate similar prohibitions for unsolicited text messages. The provisions for unsolicited text messages do not alter existing law related to unsolicited telephone calls, but simply expands the law to include text messages under the regulatory scheme in this area. As the law has changed, it is incumbent upon the agency to update its rules to conform with the newly expanded law. During the Commission Conference, the Commissioners voted unanimously to initiate a

rulemaking proceeding to incorporate references for unsolicited text messages and directed staff to prepare and submit the necessary rulemaking notices.
