I, Greg Sanford, own the two parcels #113 057.06 and parcel # 113 057.09 in Triune, an unincorporated area of Williamson County identified in the "PETITION OF TENNESSEE WASTEWATER SYSTEM TO INTERVENE" in docket No. 23-00051. These parcels are not in their supposed certified area. They are not in the Milcroftin Utility District area, as alleged in their intervention. These two parcels are in the Nolensville College Grove Utility District.

It is common knowledge that TWSI has questionable business practices, and that they intervene in cases just to delay the CCN process, where they know they cannot provide sewer services.

For the record in response to TWSI's Fraudulent statements included within the Intervention I respond to their statement identified as #4:

4. TWSI has not been contacted by the property owner or Superior about it's ability to provide service to these parcels.

Why would I, as the property owner, contact TWSI my parcels **are not** in their **supposed certified** area.

Even if my Parcels were in the **<u>supposed certified</u>** area I would not contact them, their reputations precedes them.

For the record in response to TWSI's Fraudulent statements included within the Intervention I respond to their statement identified as #5:

5. Because the Sanford Parcels are within TWSI's certified service territory, TWSI's legal rights, duties, privileges, and other legal interests related to the provision of service within its certificated territory will be directly affected by the Commissions determination in this docket.

As written above these parcels are not in their **supposed certified** area.

TWSI has no legal rights with my parcels # 113 057.06 or 113 057.09.

They have no duties as the **supposed service territory** allows them the privilege to sit on this area and let the area serve them, they do not serve the area.

I see a TPUC rule that says once a CCN is granted the utility has 3 years to serve. Why does TWSI get to make these claims at all. By TPUC rule they have lost the territory.

I would request that you assign my two parcels to the service area requested by Superior Wastewater Systems in this docket.

I urge you to throw out the petition of intervention filed by TWSI as they are just trying to delay the process, shown by them in waiting for over 20 days to file the intervention and filing it 2.5 hours before the deadline. Classless in my opinion.
