
The following are responses to your MFR letter dated July 9, 2024, related to the CCN Petition in the above referenced docket.

Rule 1220-04-13-.17(2)(a)(3) – The information is contained in Exhibit 2 to the Petition.

Rule 1220-04-13-.17(2)(d)(4) - This letter is from the Harpeth Conservancy and was filed as public comment to several draft permits issued for TWSI systems. It expresses concerns the Harpeth Conservancy has regarding TDEC's general SOP permitting and site inspection processes. This letter is not relevant to or applicable to this rule as it is not a Notice of Violation, Order, or administrative action from TDEC or another regulatory agency with jurisdiction over TWSI.

That said, it should be noted that the letter highlights that the Cox-Ladd Treatment Facility to which the Burn Subdivision will connect is an example of well operating and maintained system.
