ORDER DISMISSING PETITION WITHOUT PREJUDICE

This matter is before the Administrative Judge of the Tennessee Public Utility Commission (“Commission” or “TPUC”) authorized to administer certain preliminary issues that may arise during the preparation of this matter for hearing before the Commission. On May 28, 2024, Tennessee Wastewater Systems, Inc. (“TWSI”) filed a *Petition to Amend Its Certificate of Convenience and Necessity to Include the Burns Subdivision* (“*Petition*”) in the above-captioned matter. According to TWSI, the Burns Subdivision project has experienced several delays. The last update from TWSI dated October 6th via email stated TWSI was awaiting execution of contracts with the new Developer. In addition, there has been no response regarding whether the project has been approved by the Williamson County Planning Commission.¹

The Administrative Judge finds there have been significant changes and delays in the *Petition* that have prevented this docket from moving forward in a timely manner. Therefore, the Administrative Judge concludes the *Petition* should be dismissed without prejudice.

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED THAT:

The *Petition to Amend Its Certificate of Convenience and Necessity to Include the Burns Subdivision* is dismissed without prejudice, and the docket is closed.
