




approve the requested cancellation finding the Company in good standing.<sup>3</sup> The Commission noted in its order that S&B believed that it had transferred its CCN along with the telecommunication assets of the Company, including the right to operate under the name, Monster Broadband, Inc.<sup>4</sup>

3. Party Staff avers that because S&B's Request to Cancel has been granted the Company is no longer required to annually update its small and minority-owned telecommunications business participation plan ("SMBP Plan").

4. Therefore, Party Staff avers that its *Petition* is moot.

Therefore, Party Staff moves the Administrative Judge to enter an order dismissing its *Complaint and Petition to Convene a Show Cause Proceeding*.
