RE: Docket No: 25-00009 – Notification Regarding the Proposed Transfer of Indirect Control of QuantumShift Communications, Inc. to AppSmart TGN, Inc.

The agency received a letter on February 7, 2025, that was assigned to TPUC Docket 25-00009. The letter describes a transaction that results in the indirect transfer of control of QuantumShift Communications, Inc. ("QuantumShift").

QuantumShift elected market regulation via a letter filed February 11, 2025, that was assigned to TPUC Docket Number 25-00012. T.C.A. § 65-5-109(n) provides a description of the regulatory requirements that apply to companies that elect Market Regulation. The transfer of control, as described, is governed by T.C.A. 65-4-113, which is not a regulatory requirement that applies to companies that have elected Market Regulation. As such, the transaction described in the correspondence dated February 7, 2025, does not require approval. As no action is required by the agency, please close the above-referenced docket.
