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**NOTICE OF WITHDRAW OF PARTY STAFF, OR IN THE ALTERNATIVE,  
MOTION OF PARTY STAFF TO WITHDRAW FROM DOCKET**

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Comes now the Party Staff, which seeks to withdraw from this docket as there are no longer any contested issues between the Consumer Advocate Division of the Office of the Tennessee Attorney General (“Consumer Advocate”) and Integrated Resources Management, Inc. (“IRM”).

On March 28, 2025, IRM filed the *Petition of Integrated Resource Management, Inc. d/b/a IRM Utility for Approval to Withdraw Escrow Funds* (“*Petition*”) seeking Commission approval to withdraw escrow funds for “Non-Routine Maintenance and necessary equipment replacement.”<sup>1</sup> The Consumer Advocate intervened and engaged in extensive discussions with IRM to resolve the *Petition*. While the parties made progress, additional guidance was sought from the Commission. Party Staff participated in this docket at the request of the Consumer Advocate and IRM to assist and participate in discussions of unresolved or otherwise contested issues.<sup>2</sup>

On August 19, 2025, IRM filed the *Amended Petition of Integrated Resource Management, Inc. d/b/a IRM Utility for Approval to Withdraw Escrow Funds* (“*Amended Petition*”). On August

22, 2025, the Consumer Advocate filed a letter indicating that the *Amended Petition* reflected the discussions among the parties and that there were no longer any contested issues.<sup>3</sup> As there are no other contested issues remaining in the docket, the Party Staff seeks to withdraw from the docket. Further participation in this docket by Party Staff serves no purpose. Withdrawing from the docket will allow the designated Party Staff members to more fully focus on other assignments and duties. Members of the Party Staff will not serve or participate in any advisory capacity to the Commission regarding this docket.
