On May 1, 2025, the Commission initiated this docket concerning the Tennessee Relay Center Program ("Relay Center"). This program offers free, around-the-clock assisted telephone services through analog teletypewriters and text telephone devices for individuals with speech, hearing, and visual impairments.

With the rapid advancements in telecommunications technology, the use of analog-based services and associated devices is being phased out, as Internet Protocol (IP) services and wireless devices are becoming the prevailing standard for telecommunications. Consequently, the usage of the Relay Center has significantly declined over the past few years. As the Commission seeks a provider to deliver services for the Relay Center beyond 2026, it is crucial that current users make the transition to IP-based telecommunications relay services as soon as possible. This will help ensure that users do not encounter any interruptions in accessing this vital service.
