PRE-FILED DIRECT TESTIMONY OF CONNER ROBERTSON

Q. PLEASE STATE YOUR NAME AND BUSINESS ADDRESS.

A. My name is Conner Robertson. My business address is 502 Deaderick Street, 4th Floor,
Nashville, Tennessee.

Q. BY WHOM ARE YOU EMPLOYED AND IN WHAT CAPACITY?

A. I am employed by the Tennessee Public Utility Commission. I am an Administrative
Services Assistant 4.

**Q. DO YOUR RESPONSIBILITIES AT THE TENNESSEE PUBLIC UTILITY
COMMISSION INCLUDE DUTIES RELATED TO RECEIVING AND PROCESSING
ANNUAL INSPECTION FEES?**

A. Yes. Part of my duties in the fiscal division of the Commission requires me to receive and
review the annual revenue certification forms that calculate the amount of the annual inspection
fees for regulated public utilities. I input the payment into our receipting and tracking system. If a
regulated public utility does not submit its annual revenue filing and annual inspection fee by the
deadline established by law, the fiscal division sends reminder letters that the payment is

delinquent. If we are still unable to obtain payment, I refer the public utility to the Commission's General Counsel for further action.

Q. IN THE COURSE OF YOUR DUTIES RELATED TO RECEIVING AND PROCESSING ANNUAL INSPECTION FEES, HAVE YOU BECOME AWARE OF A PUBLIC UTILITY KNOWN AS MONSTER BROADBAND INC. (now known as S&B Tennessee Enterprises Inc.) ("S&B TN")?

A. Yes. The Company did not submit the annual revenue report and annual inspection fee that was due on April 1, 2025. Upon reviewing the Company's information, I discovered that the Company also did not submit the annual revenue report and annual inspection fee that was due on April 1, 2024.

Q. WHAT, IF ANYTHING, DID THE COMMISSION DO IN RESPONSE TO THE COMPANY NOT PAYING ITS ANNUAL INSPECTION FEES THAT WERE DUE IN 2024 AND 2025?

A. The Fiscal Division sent letters to the Company on May 9, 2024, June 11, 2024, July 17, 2024, and April 10, 2025 to remind the Company of its delinquent annual inspection fees. The July 17, 2024 letter was sent certified, return receipt requested. The return receipt was signed by "T Moore" on July 22, 2024. A copy of the letters and the return receipt is attached to my testimony as Exhibit 1.

Q. WHAT IF ANYTHING DID THE COMPANY DO IN RESPONSE TO THE COMMISSION LETTERS?

A. The Commission received no response to any of the letters.

Q. DOES THIS CONCLUDE YOUR TESTIMONY?
