

**ORDER GRANTING CANCELLATION OF AUTHORITY TO PROVIDE
CUSTOMER OWNED COIN OR COINLESS OPERATED TELEPHONE SERVICE**

This matter came before Chairman Eddie Roberson, Director Sara Kyle and Director Mary W. Freeman of the Tennessee Regulatory Authority ("TRA"), the voting panel assigned to this docket, at a regularly scheduled Authority Conference held on May 18, 2009. Thomas Payphones (the "Company") originally filed an Application to provide Customer Owned Coin or Coinless Operated Telephone ("COCOT") service within the State of Tennessee on February 22, 1991. On April 16, 1991, the Tennessee Public Service Commission issued an order stating that the Company had met all the requirements to provide COCOT service in Tennessee.¹ On April 15, 2009, the Company requested that the TRA cancel its authority. Based upon careful consideration of the record in this matter, the panel voted unanimously to cancel, by request, the authority of Thomas Payphones to provide COCOT service in Tennessee.



¹ The Company's authority to provide COCOT service in Tennessee was revoked at an Authority Conference held on November 6, 2001 due to non-payment of fees and was reinstated at an Authority Conference held on December 18, 2001.
