
ORDER GRANTING CANCELLATION OF AUTHORITY TO PROVIDE
CUSTOMER OWNED COIN OR COINLESS OPERATED TELEPHONE SERVICE

This matter came before Chairman Sara Kyle, Director Eddie Roberson and Director Kenneth C. Hill of the Tennessee Regulatory Authority ("TRA"), the voting panel assigned to this docket, at a regularly scheduled Authority Conference held on October 26, 2009. Smoky Mountain Communications (the "Company") originally filed an Application to provide Customer Owned Coin or Coinless Operated Telephone ("COCOT") service within the State of Tennessee on August 18, 1994. On September 7, 1994, the Tennessee Public Service Commission issued an order stating that the Company had met all the requirements to provide COCOT service in Tennessee. On August 18, 2009, the Company requested that the TRA cancel its authority.¹ Based upon careful consideration of the record in this matter, the panel voted unanimously to cancel, by request, the authority of Smoky Mountain Communications to provide COCOT service in Tennessee.
