**ORDER APPROVING COMPANY'S CANCELLATION REQUEST**

---

This matter came before Vice Chairman John Hie, Commissioner Herbert H. Hilliard, Commissioner Clay R. Good, Commissioner Kenneth C. Hill, and Commissioner David Crowell of the Tennessee Public Utility Commission (the “Commission” or “TPUC”), the voting panel assigned to this docket, during a regularly scheduled Commission Conference held on September 15, 2025. On September 19, 1996, the Tennessee Regulatory Authority, now TPUC, issued an order granting Access Point, Inc. (“Access Point” or “Company”) a CCN to provide resold interexchange telecommunications services.<sup>1</sup> On March 21, 2019, the Company filed its request to cancel its CCN, asserting that, as of January 1, 2019, it no longer provided telecommunications services in Tennessee.<sup>2</sup> However, AT&T later informed the Commission that Access Point still had active accounts on its network providing telecommunications services in Tennessee.<sup>3</sup>

On August 8, 2025, BellSouth Telecommunications, LLC d/b/a AT&T Tennessee filed its Interconnection Agreement between AT&T and GC Pivotal, LLC d/b/a Global Capacity (“GC Pivotal”), in which the parties agreed that GC Pivotal would assume Access Point’s obligations to

provide telecommunications services in Tennessee.<sup>4</sup> Since Access Point no longer provides telecommunications services to customers in Tennessee, it has no need to retain its CCN. With the additional proof that service is discontinued, the Company is in good standing with the Commission concerning payment of mandatory inspection fees. After careful consideration of the entire record in this matter, the Commissioners voted unanimously to approve the Company's request to cancel its CCN.
