Enclosed are replacement tariff pages and attachments for United Telephone-Southeast, Inc.'s (United) Annual Price Cap filing, Tariff No. 96-201, Docket No. 96-01423. These replacement pages and the accompanying attachments replace in their entirety the previous tariff filings and workpapers in this docket and are being made in support of the stipulated agreement on methodology reached among all the parties of record in this proceeding.

The tariff replacement pages include proposals 1) to implement a charge for Directory Assistance of \$0.29 with three allowances per business and residence line, 2) to reduce the Switched Access Interconnection Charge that is currently being assessed on a per access minute basis to the all carriers interconnecting with the Company's switched access network and 3) to reduce the Carrier Common Line access rate for terminating minutes. The proposed rates for Directory Assistance mirror the rates for United's customers in the Company's contiguous operating territory in Virginia.

Documentation which United considers to be "proprietary information" is included to support the calculations and proposed tariffs. Please contact Kim Denton at (919) 554-7399 or Laura Sykora at (919) 554-7323 before releasing any of the proprietary information.

Non-Basic Revenue Adjustment

On June 24, 1996, United Telephone placed into effect a revenue neutral filing for Custom Calling Features, DID Rates, and Service Connection Charges. In reviewing the information associated with the filing, United has determined that a percentage of the reduction in Service Connection Charges more appropriately belongs in the Basic Service Category. A filing to reflect this change is being made separate and apart from this docket.

U3.8.1 GENERAL

Verification service provides operator assistance in determining if a called line is in use. Interruption service provides for operator interruption of a conversation in progress on a called line. The customer may request these services for a charge, where facilities are available, by calling the "0" Operator.

U3.8.2 APPLICATION OF CHARGES

1. The charges specified in c. following will apply to all requests except:
 - (a) Emergency requests from official emergency agencies when the request is received on an agency line from agency personnel.
 - (b) Emergency requests in which the caller identifies that the request is to (1) an official public emergency agency; (2) an emergency medical number; or (3) a privately endowed and operated suicide, drug, alcohol, or runaway crisis reporting center.
 - (c) Requests in which the operator encounters a trouble condition or has reason to believe a trouble condition exists.

U3.8.3 RATES

1. Verification: A charge of \$.50 applies each time the operator verifies a called line and hears voice communication.
2. Interruption: A charge of \$1.00 applies each time the operator interrupts a conversation that is in progress on the called line. The charge is for the interrupt service and does not depend on whether the called party agrees to release the line and accept the call.
3. If an operator both verifies the condition of the line and interrupts conversation on the same request, the interrupt charge only applies.
4. The charges for Verify/Interrupt service are in addition to any applicable message rates.

The Lifeline Assistance Program adopted by the Tennessee Public Service Commission provides for a state subsidy equal to 100 percent of the Interstate Subscriber Line Charge. The program has also been certified by the Federal Communications Commission which allows for the Company to waive the Interstate Subscriber Line Charge.

The Lifeline Assistance Program is available only in conjunction with Residence Budget Service (see U3.3.2.2). This program applies to the local service bills for qualified residential recipients of Aid to Families with Dependent Children (AFDC), Supplemental Security Income (SSI) or Food Stamps.

U3. 11.2 Application and Regulations

- A. A standard application will be available to the subscriber and evidence of certification by the agency must be provided to the Company.
- B. The Company will confirm and reconcile eligibility upon initial application to the program and semiannually by providing the agency involved with data transmission of all credit recipients. U3.12.1 GENERAL

(T)

Exchange service as set forth in Section U1 and General Regulations as set forth in Section U2 of this tariff is furnished for the exclusive use of the subscriber, employees, agents, representatives and/or members of the subscriber's domestic establishment. Resale of basic local exchange service(s) is permitted only under specific conditions as described in this tariff. For the purpose of this tariff, sharing of basic local exchange service is considered to be synonymous with resale of basic local exchange service and will be referred to as Shared Tenant Service (STS).

The following definitions are applicable to the Shared Tenant Service:

- a. STS offering is the provision of basic local exchange service for sharing or reselling by the STS provider.
- b. STS provider is the customer of record/subscriber with the company and the provider of basic local exchange service to its tenants/guests/clients.
- c. STS area is the specifically identified contiguous property area(s) under the control of the STS provider.
- d. STS client is the end user of the STS offering.

Exchange access lines are subject to the nonrecurring charges specified in Section U4 of this tariff.

U3.12.2 CONDITIONS

(T)

- a. The STS provider may be a person, company, or corporation or authorized representative responsible for placing application for service; requesting additions, rearrangements, maintenance, or discontinuances of service; payment in full of charges incurred or any sum due to the company.
- b. STS offering is allowed where facilities permit and only within the confines of specifically identified contiguous property area. STS area designated for STS offering may be intersected by public thoroughfares provided that in the absence of such thoroughfares the STS area would be contiguous property.
- c. STS area must be within the confines of the existing wire center and/or telephone exchange boundaries. The location of the STS provider's communication switching equipment will determine the wire center and/or telephone exchange serving the STS area. The STS area must be under the control of the STS provider or within a common development with a single name identity, i.e., office parks, shopping centers, apartment complexes, condominiums, time share condominiums, nursing homes, hospitals, hotels, motels, military bases, college campuses, etc.
- d. Potential STS provider(s) must furnish the company with a written description of the STS offering master plan, a detailed map depicting the geographical location of the STS area including but not limited to political boundaries, natural boundaries such as rivers, creeks, ravines, swamps, marsh, etc., existing or proposed public or private thoroughfares, existing or proposed public private right(s)-of-way and/or any other information the company may need.

- e. STS offering may not exceed a combined total of five hundred (500) inward, outward and/or two-way flat and/or measured individual exchange facilities/lines.
- f. The company will furnish basic local exchange telephone service to a STS client when requested. Only measured individual exchange line(s) will be provided to the STS client as described in U3.11.4 of this tariff. These exchange line(s) will not be used in the totaling referred to in e. above.

The company generally installs and maintains its own facilities to reach the premises of each individual subscriber. In the instances where the Company services an STS client, at the Company's option, in lieu of Company owned facilities, the Company may choose to utilize privately owned distribution facilities within the STS area. In the instances where the Company utilizes privately owned distribution facilities, the Company must have access to the facilities unless alternate mutually beneficial arrangements exist. Regardless of the method chosen, the Company must be granted this right by the STS provider within the STS area.

- g. Nothing in the STS tariff impairs the Company's franchise or ability to operate. The STS tariff is not intended to, nor does it, enfranchise or certify the STS provider as a telecommunications company.

Nothing in the STS tariff conveys any obligation to the Company beyond the point of demarcation at the STS provider's communication switching equipment or the STS client's premises when served by the Company.

- h. Intercom type calling among STS clients of the STS offering is permitted to the extent that such calling is privately beneficial to the STS clients and not detrimental to the public.
- i. Interconnection between STS offerings is prohibited.
- j. The STS provider will be the single point of contact for all STS client services including those clients desiring service from both the STS provider and the Company.
- k. Where the STS Provider subscribes to ABC service, the number of simultaneous exchange and toll network calls to and from ABC access lines is limited by the number of Network Access Registers ordered by the STS Provider. Each Network Access Register may be arranged for two-way, one-way incoming or one-way outgoing operation depending upon the option chosen by the customer at the time the Network Access Register is installed.

U18. LONG DISTANCE MESSAGE TELECOMMUNICATIONS SERVICE

U18.1 APPLICATION

This tariff applies to Long Distance Message Telecommunications Service (MTS) furnished or made available by the Company and its connecting companies, over facilities wholly within the Geographic Market Area (GMA) or LATA within the State of Tennessee.

U18.2 GENERAL

- a. Long Distance Message Telecommunications Services are categorized as follows:
 1. IntraLATA MTS is categorized as imperfectly competitive and receives price ceiling treatment.
 2. Operator Call Completion is categorized as imperfectly competitive and receives price ceiling treatment.
 3. Long Distance Operator Verification/Interruption service is categorized as other monopoly and receives monopoly treatment.
- b. Long Distance Message Telecommunications Service is that of furnishing facilities for communications between stations in different rate centers for either two-point or conference service.
- c. Rates for service between points are based on airline mileage between rate centers. In general, each point is designated as a rate center except that certain small towns or communities are assigned adjacent rate centers with which they are closely associated for communication purposes or by community of interest. Airline mileages between rate centers are determined as provided in U18.5 following.
- d. Customer or Other Common Carrier-provided terminal equipment or system may be used with facilities furnished to the customer by the Telephone Company for Long Distance MTS as specified in Section U15 preceding.
- e. Long Distance MTS is provided for use by the Customer and may be used by others when so authorized by the Customer. Use of the service is subject to regulations in Section U2, with the exception of Sections U2.2.1a and U2.2.1b which restrict the use of service and prohibit payment to the Customer by another for use of the service.
- f. For completing calls within the Company's Tennessee LATA, customers dial only the seven (7) digit telephone number. At the request of a customer, seven (7) digit dialing can be restricted to the local calling area, with all remaining calls within the Company's Tennessee LATA dialed as 1+423+7 digits.

Calls originated from public telephones, joint operated or customer provided public telephones require 1+423+7 digits to complete calls outside the local calling area.

The Company will have a liberal payment policy on the first month's billing of seven (7) digit dialed calls usage charges, providing credit if the customer was unaware charges applied.

g. **Directory Assistance Service**

Regulations and rates are specified for Directory Assistance Service in Section U17 of this Company's General Subscriber Services Tariff.

U18.3 TWO-POINT SERVICE

U18.3.1 Service Between Land Wire Stations

a. Classes of Service

Service is offered on a Station-to-Station basis, as either Dial, Dial Credit Card, or Operator, or on a Person-to-Person basis. These four classes of calls are defined in Section U1, Definition of Terms.

b. Long Distance Minutes and Differentials

1. All rates given in the rate table in f. following are for each minute or any fraction thereof for the connection.
2. Differentials for Dial Credit Card Station-to-Station, Operator Station-to-Station and Person-to-Person calls are stated in f. following. No differential applies for Dial Station-to-Station calls.

After determining the Basic Rate as specified in f.1. and 2. following, differentials are added where appropriate.

c. Timing of Messages

1. The time when connection is established, as provided in 2. through 5. following, determined in accordance with the time - standard or daylight saving - observed at the location of the rate center of the calling station, determines what rate schedule applies. This rule applies whether the call is originated as paid or collect.
2. On all Station-to-Station calls, chargeable time begins when connection is established between the calling telephone and the called telephone, or PBX system.
3. On Person-to-Person calls, chargeable time begins when connection is established between the calling person and the particular person or station specified or an agreed alternate.
4. Chargeable time ends when the calling station "hangs up" thereby releasing the network connection. If the called station "hangs up" but the calling station does not, chargeable time ends when the network connection is released either by automatic timing equipment in the telephone network or by the Telephone Company operator.
5. Chargeable time does not include time lost because of faults or defects in the service.

d. Reversal of Charges (Collect Calls)

1. Collect calls are permissible for all telephone calls provided the charges are accepted at the called station. When a collect call is attempted to a public or joint operated coin telephone, the charges must be billed to a credit card or third party number, or the call may be reoriginated from the called station.
2. The regularly established Operator Station-to-Station or Person-to-Person rates apply.

e. Collection of Charges at Coin Telephones

Charges for calls to be collected at coin box telephones will be the total charge as provided in f. following.

6.7.13 Mileage Measurement (Cont'd)

(E) Mileage for access minutes in the originating direction over Feature Group A Switched Access Service will be calculated on an airline basis, using the V&H coordinates method, between the end office switch where the Feature Group A switching dial tone is provided and the customer's serving wire center for the Switched Access Service is provided. This exception does not apply to access minutes originating and/or terminating in an Extended Area Service area as set forth in 6.7.1(D)(5) preceding. Extended Area Service area mileage measurement exceptions are found in (L) following.

(F) When trunks are rerouted from an end office to an access tandem as set forth in 6.7.1(c)(3) preceding, the Switched Transport mileage will be calculated on the airline distance between the end office and the serving wire center of the customer's POP associated with that access tandem.

(G) When the Alternate Traffic Routing optional feature is provided with Feature Groups B, C and D to provide service from an end office to different customer premises locations, usage rated **Switched** Transport access minutes will be apportioned between **the two** transmission routes used to provide this feature. For Feature Groups B and C, such apportionment will be made using standard Telephone Company traffic engineering methodology and will be based on the last trunk CCS desired for the high usage group, as described in **6.3.1(0)** preceding, and the relative capacity ordered to the end office, when the feature is provided at an end office switch, or to the subtending end offices when the feature is provided at an access tandem switch. For Feature Group D, the apportionment will be based on the actual measured data which is recorded against the specific trunk group that carried a particular call. This apportionment will serve as the basis for the **Switched** Transport mileage calculation. The customer will be billed accordingly.
