**ORDER REVOKING AUTHORITY TO PROVIDE OPERATOR SERVICES
AND/OR RESELL TELECOMMUNICATIONS SERVICES IN TENNESSEE
FOR NON-PAYMENT OF FEES**

This matter came before Chairman Eddie Roberson, Director Sara Kyle and Director Ron Jones of the Tennessee Regulatory Authority (the "Authority"), the voting panel assigned to this docket, at a regularly scheduled Authority Conference held on January 28, 2008 to cancel the authority of CTC Long Distance Services, Inc. (the "Company") to provide operator services and/or resell telecommunications services in Tennessee due to non-payment of its annual inspection fee pursuant to Tenn. Code Ann. § 65-4-301(a)(1) (2004).¹

The Company originally filed an Application to provide operator services and/or resell telecommunications services within the State of Tennessee on November 25, 1996. During a regularly scheduled Authority Conference held on March 18, 1997, the Directors found that the Company had met all the requirements for certification and the requirements of Tenn. Comp. R. & Regs. 1220-4-2-.57, which was promulgated pursuant to, *inter alia*, Tenn. Code Ann. § 65-2-102 and Tenn. Code Ann. § 65-4-201, and approved the Application.

¹ Tenn. Code Ann. § 65-4-301(a)(1) (2004) provides:

Every public utility doing business in this state and subject to the control and jurisdiction of the authority to which the provisions of this chapter apply, shall pay to the state of Tennessee on or before April 1 of each year, a fee for the inspection, control and supervision of the business, service and rates of such public utility.

An initial notice advising the Company of its failure to comply with the requirements of Tenn. Code Ann. § 65-4-301(a)(1) (2004) was mailed on February 12, 2007. A second notice was mailed on July 13, 2007. Finally, a Notice of Cancellation was mailed on November 29, 2007 via certified mail. The Company failed to respond. As a result of that failure, this matter was placed on the January 28, 2008 Authority Conference for the panel to consider revocation of the authority of the Company to provide operator services and/or resell telecommunications services due to non-payment of fees.

Based upon careful consideration of the record in this matter, the panel voted unanimously to revoke the authority of the Company to provide operator services and/or resell telecommunications services in Tennessee.

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED THAT:

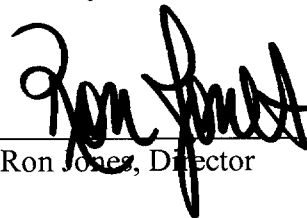
