ORDER GRANTING CANCELLATION OF AUTHORITY TO PROVIDE TELECOMMUNICATIONS SERVICES

This matter came before Director Eddie Roberson, Director Pat Miller and Director Ron Jones of the Tennessee Regulatory Authority ("Authority"), the voting panel assigned to this docket, at a regularly scheduled Authority Conference held on June 25, 2007. An Application for a Certificate of Public Convenience and Necessity ("CCN") to provide local exchange, exchange access and interexchange telecommunications services in Tennessee was filed by Qwest Interprise America, Inc.¹ (the "Company") on July 25, 1997. During a Hearing held on September 9, 1997, the Directors found that the Company had met all the requirements for certification and approved the Application. On October 19, 2006, the Company requested that the Authority cancel its CCN, effective ninety days from the date of the request. Based upon careful consideration of the entire record in this matter, the panel voted unanimously to grant the Company's request to cancel its CCN.²
