**ORDER GRANTING CANCELLATION OF AUTHORITY
TO PROVIDE TELECOMMUNICATIONS SERVICES**

This matter came before Chairman Herbert H. Hilliard, Director Kenneth C. Hill and Director Robin Bennett of the Tennessee Regulatory Authority (the "Authority" or "TRA"), the voting panel assigned to this docket, at a regularly scheduled Authority Conference held on April 20, 2015. An Application for a Certificate of Public Convenience and Necessity ("CCN") to provide switched and resold local exchange and exchange access telecommunications services in Tennessee was filed by DIECA Communications, Inc. d/b/a Covad Communications Company ("DIECA") on October 26, 1999. During an Authority Conference held on March 28, 2000, the Directors found that DIECA had met all the requirements for certification and approved the Application. DIECA notified the TRA on January 8, 2013 of a name change to MegaPath Corporation ("MegaPath").¹ On January 29, 2015, the TRA received a request from MegaPath to cancel its CCN.² Based upon careful consideration of the entire record in this matter, the Directors voted unanimously to grant the request to cancel MegaPath's CCN.
