In Re: *Petition of Family Stations, Inc. in Williamson County, Tennessee to Determine if a CCN is Needed*, TPUC Docket No. 26-00012.

Dear Chairman Jones:

On February 12, 2026, Family Stations, Inc. (the "Petitioner") filed its Petition for a determination of need for a Certificate of Convenience and Necessity ("CCN") by the Tennessee Public Utility Commission. In its cover letter, the Petitioner describes the project as follows:

This project consists of a proposed 5,000 gallon per day wastewater system to be privately owned by Family Stations, Inc. The wastewater system will serve a proposed religious non-profit institution owned by the same entity at the above-referenced property in Williamson County, TN. The intent of the project is to create a multi-phase campus proposed as a multi-media ministry campus.

The Consumer Advocate has completed its review of the documents filed on February 12th, and respectfully expresses its intent not to intervene in this proceeding.
