Re: Docket No. 26-00017 – *Petition of Edge Wastewater Utilities, LLC for a Certificate of Convenience and Necessity to Include the Baker Farms Subdivision in Maury County, Tennessee*

Dear Mr. Nicks:

The Company must revise the proposed tariff document issued by Edge Wastewater Utilities, LLC on August 27, 2026, in Commission Docket No. 26-00017. In that filing, the Company included changes to billing practices and customer charges that are inconsistent with the tariff submitted with the Company's petition for a Certificate of Convenience and Necessity to Include the Baker Farms Subdivision in Maury County, Tennessee, which the Commission approved during its August 17 deliberations.

Although the following list is not exhaustive, Commission Staff observed several inconsistencies:

- 1) The disconnection fee was increased from the approved forty dollars (\$40) to fifty dollars (\$50).
- 2) The Credit card convenience fee was increased from the approved 2.45%, with a \$1.25 minimum fee, to 2.50% with a \$1.95 minimum fee.
- 3) The approved capacity reservation fee was to be pro-rated for the month a customer is tapped onto the system and signs a contract for service with the utility. However, the August 27 tariff proposes that capacity reservation fees will be retained by the Company instead of being pro-rated during the month customers are connected to the utility system. This results in a greater financial burden to customers of the utility and was not considered in the August 17 ruling.

In addition, an administrative error appears in the proposed tariff issued on August 27, 2026. The pages of the proposed tariff are marked as being issued on August 17, 2026. The issuance date should reflect the date the tariff is submitted to the Commission. Therefore, any revised tariff must reflect the date it is sent to the Commission, while the *effective date* should remain August 17, 2026.

It should be noted that the aesthetic changes of the August 27 proposed tariff such as formatting and pagination are acceptable.

All wastewater utilities regulated by the Commission are required to have an approved tariff on file per Commission Rule 1220-04-13-.17(2)(e)(8). Therefore, Edge Wastewater Utilities, LLC, must submit a revised tariff filing that is consistent with the proposed tariff filed with its Petition and subsequently approved by the Commission.
